Understanding Stratification

Definition:

Social stratification is the ranking of individuals and groups in any given society.

Bases of Stratification: Wealth, power, prestige, race, ethnicity, gender, and education.

Forms:

- 1. Caste system closed, no mobility.
- 2. Class system open, mobility possible.

Social Mobility

Definition: The movement of individuals or groups from one social position to another.

Types of Mobility:

- 1. **Upward Mobility** moving to a higher status (e.g., scholarship student becoming a doctor).
- 2. **Downward Mobility** losing status (e.g., bankruptcy).
- 3. *Horizontal Mobility* change in role without change in status.

Importance: Reflects both opportunities and inequalities in society.
