

Call For Papers

The 75th annual meeting of the New York State Association of European Historians will be held in Albany, NY at the University at Albany, SUNY, October 10-11, 2025.

Howard G. Brown, of Binghamton University, will deliver the James A. Valone Keynote Address, “To Behead or not to Behead: Popular Violence and Public Executions in the French Revolution,” Friday evening following a reception and dinner. Concurrent panels will take place Saturday morning and afternoon.

We encourage submissions addressing any aspect of European history or Europe’s connections with New York State or the wider world, in any time period. We invite traditional research presentations and pedagogy-focused presentations from professional historians and graduate students, as well as undergraduate paper presentations. Full panel proposals are also welcome.

The Association provides a welcoming and collegial atmosphere at its conferences, and we particularly encourage graduate students and independent and early-career scholars to submit proposals, including papers based on work(s)-in-progress. Graduate students presenting at the conference may submit their work for consideration in the annual [Barbara Blaszak Prize](#) competition, which awards \$500 to the best graduate student paper. Graduate students will also be eligible for a reduced registration fee.

Proposals for presentations and/or panels should include an abstract of no more than 250 words for each presentation and a one-paragraph biography for each presenter.
