## TGIF COVID-19 Emergency Fund Overview

The Green Initiative Fund (TGIF)'s COVID-19 Emergency Fund provides support for active TGIF projects that have been adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic this Spring 2020 semester. In May 2020, the TGIF Committee voted to approve up to \$30,000 in relief grant funding for active TGIF projects who've had their projects irrevocably affected, such as sunken costs associated with wages, honorariums, venue deposits, and other budget line items. Applicants can apply up to \$10,000 per project. Applicants must fill out a short Google Form application, and some applicants may be invited to a Zoom call with TGIF's COVID-19 Workgroup to discuss project circumstances. The TGIF COVID-19 Workgroup will assess applications using the TGIF COVID-19 Emergency Rubric (below) and will be the decision-making body for the emergency fund.

## **Eligibility**:

- Must be an active TGIF project (have attended at least one TGIF semesterly check-in)
- TGIF project altered due to COVID-19 pandemic
