School Hours

School starts at 8:50 a.m. Please have your child arrive at school no later than 8:45 a.m. Children who do not take the bus should not arrive at school before 8:30 a.m.

Dismissal begins at 3:00 p.m. for parent/guardian pick-ups. The bus loop at the front of the building is closed to all traffic at 2:30. During that time please park in the lot next to the building. If your child is out for the day or you need to make changes to dismissal, please send a note or call (207) 222-1250 before noon. Please do not send emails to the office with this information in case there is an absence and we cannot retrieve the message in time.

GENERAL PROCEDURAL INFORMATION

Student Bus Procedures

The bus driver may assign seats. Students are expected to follow the school bus safety and awareness rules outlined by the Transportation Department. Families and students should review the following bus guidelines together:

- Take a seat and stay seated until the bus reaches your destination.
- Talk in a normal tone so that you do not distract the driver.
- Keep the aisle and the emergency exits clear of all belongings.
- Drinking and eating are not permitted on the bus.
- Be courteous, and use appropriate language.
- Respect others' personal space and property.
- Students are highly encouraged to leave toys and valuables at home.

Pets on School Property

For the safety and comfort of all students, families, and staff, dogs and other pets are not allowed on school property. This includes all fields, spectator areas, parking lots, walkways, and playgrounds. We love animals, but keeping our school grounds pet-free helps ensure a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.

Community Use of School Facilities and Grounds

Attendance/Truancy

Regular attendance is essential for student success. We expect students to attend school every day unless they are ill, have a family emergency, or have an approved planned vacation. Families should notify the school as soon as possible if a student will be absent.

- Reporting Absences: Call the office at (207) 222-1250 by 8:45 a.m. to report a tardy or absence.
- Excused Absences: Illness, family emergencies, medical appointments, religious observances, or other reasons approved by the principal.
- Chronic Absenteeism: Students who miss 10% or more of the school year, excused or unexcused, will be considered chronically absent, and early intervention steps will be taken.

Dress Code

We strive to create a positive, safe, and respectful learning environment. Students should wear comfortable clothing that allows full participation in school activities, including physical education and outdoor recess, and that is appropriate for the day's weather.

Electronic Devices and Cell Phones

Students are strongly discouraged from bringing personal electronic devices to school. All personal electronic devices must be turned off and put away during the school day unless determined to be



essential for a student's health or safety by administrators. Narragansett Elementary School is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices.

Toys from home

Although we understand that children want to share their toys and new possessions with their friends, we ask that toys from home not be brought to school. Staff will not accept responsibility for any personal toys that are broken, lost or damaged in any way.

Student Celebration Invitations

To ensure that all students feel included and valued: invitations distributed during class time must include the entire class; invitations for a partial guest list should be distributed outside of school hours and off school property.

COMMUNICATION FROM THE MAIN OFFICE

Thursday Folder (Electronic)

Families receive one notification each week from the main office, sent on Thursdays via email, including upcoming events, school-wide notifications, and approved community flyers as PDF attachments. Families without an email on file will receive paper copies home in their child's backpack.

Thrillshare

Thrillshare manages online interactions between Narragansett and families. Communications of timely importance are sent through this electronic notification system from both the school and Central Office as needed.

ReachMyTeach

ReachMyTeach is a two-way communication platform connecting families and educators through the languages and devices families use every day, via email and text message.

Media/Social Media

With family permission, we celebrate student accomplishments in local media and on social media, including Facebook (@narragansettgorham) and Instagram (Narragansett_School).

NARRAGANSETT ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Drop Off in the Morning

Students should be dropped off in the parking lot drive-thru area only, beginning at 8:30 a.m. Students dropped off after 8:50 a.m. will need to be accompanied into the main office and signed in.



Parent/Guardian Pick Up

Families who pick up their student every day or on certain days of every week (“Dailies”) should send in a note to let the office know. Families picking up occasionally (“Just for Today”) should call the office at (207) 222-1250 by noon.

Pick Up Procedure

All parent/guardian pick-ups begin at 3:05 p.m. Students are dismissed from their classroom and walk to Door 8, where staff direct them to their pick-up vehicle.

Walkers and Bikers

Students in Grades 4-5 are able to walk or bike home with a completed family authorization form on file. Bikers under age 16 are required by Maine State Law to wear a helmet. The arrival window for all students — walkers, bikers, bus riders, and car riders — is 8:30 a.m. to 8:50 a.m.

RECESS, FIELD TRIPS, AND ACTIVITIES

Recess and Movement Breaks

Temperature is checked using the National Weather Service “feels like” reading for the Gorham zip code. If the feels-like temperature is 10 degrees or above, students go outside for recess. The decision is made by 11:10 a.m. for lunch recesses.

Research supports regular movement breaks throughout the day; as well as a specific physical break that allows students to get some fresh air and to have unstructured play. Staff will incorporate opportunities for students to engage in physical movement throughout the day. Staff will schedule a formal movement break each day. This may be done on an individual basis or scheduled by a whole grade level.

Field Trips

Each K-5 class in Gorham participates in two field trips or extra-curricular activities a year. Chaperones must be registered and complete training through the Gorham School Volunteer Program.

Before School Activities — Kids Connect Clubs

Open to K-5th graders in 4-week sessions (fall, winter, spring). Students are dropped off in the gym at 7:35 a.m.; activities run 7:45-8:30 a.m., after which students transition to their classroom.

Emergency Preparedness

Parent Information Guide

The guide is a summary of the Gorham School Department's Comprehensive Health and Safety and Emergency Management Plan. Explaining the district's general approach to preparedness, emergency response, communication, reunification, and recovery.

Fire drills are conducted 8-10 times over the course of the school year, with the first few announced to students and staff ahead of time.

Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and ALICE Drills and Lessons

The safety of our students and staff is our top priority. SRP provides shared Lockdown announcements and immediate protective actions. A.L.I.C.E. stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate. ALICE gives trained staff options based on their location, available information and changing conditions during a violent critical incident. The training at Narragansett is age-appropriate and takes place in the classroom with the teacher leading the discussion; for younger students, lessons are simple and reassuring, focused on listening carefully and following directions quickly.

School Cancellation Announcement

The Gorham School District uses an automated program to call families when there is no school. Information is also posted on the district website, and local radio and television stations make announcements.

Guardians, or adult students, may request to review education records in writing using this form below or an email explaining which records are being requested and send to their school administration or Office of Special Services by mail to 75 South Street, Suite 2, Gorham, Maine 04038 or may email directly to Administrative Assistant of Special Services, Suzanne Berthiaume, at suzanne.berthiaume@gorhamschools.org. The district has 45 calendar days to make records available for review.

Once the school district receives the request, they will be in touch to set up an appointment for the guardians to complete the review or with any clarifying questions. The school district has 45 calendar days to make the records available for review. If copies are being requested, there may be a charge of \$0.15 per page (fee may be waived if family can show it would be undue hardship)
