GENERAL

CRCKY

CRCKY (crc4me.org) provides assistance to immigrant households. Call or text 1-800-674-9217, 8:00 am to midnight, Monday-Friday, for emergencies. If you do not speak English, leave a message in Spanish over the phone, or text us in your preferred language. We will call you back with an interpreter. Email crcky@crcky.org with questions. Services include:

- Referral to free immigration law consultations with a reputable attorney.
- CRCKY is a Department of Justice recognized site. Our DOJ Partially Accredited Representatives can represent clients in affirmative proceedings (going to USCIS, not Immigration Court).
- Asylum petition assistance. CRCKY's Pro Se Program is open to new immigrants who have been in the U.S. for less than a year and want to submit an asylum application and request for work authorization. This program is free, but spaces are limited. Call on the first first Monday of the month, between 10:30 in the morning and 12:30 in the afternoon only.
- Free passports and Special Power of Attorney for US citizen children of parents who are not U.S. citizens.
- Referral to medical clinics, eye doctors, mental health services, and pharmacies that provide free and low-cost services to people who do not have insurance, for adults and children
- Food assistance: deliveries are available April-December, if needed, on a limited basis.
- One time diaper and wipes delivery: option of second delivery of cloth diapers and pins if needed.
- Bus training on how to use the bus system: one-time bus pass with 20 rides on it. Bus passes available on a case-by-case basis.
- Referrals to free English classes
- Regularly updated, extensive "Where to Find Help" resource packet, available in 5 languages on our website (and available upon request in over 100 other languages.) Please note: our website is available in Spanish, and French, as well as English.

Catholic Charities

Catholic Charities respond to phone calls asking for assistance. Leave a message (859-253-3339) on their answering machine, in English or Spanish. CC provides limited assistance with utility and water bills, on a case by case basis. Website is

available in English, French, Spanish, and Swahili. "Bridging the Gap" Program for utility assistance can be found <u>here</u>.

KRM

KRM (Kentucky Refugees Ministries) provides a variety of services to refugees and asylum seekers. These include legal assistance. They are able to help those who *DO* qualify for unemployment but who have language barriers to applying (regardless of whether they are a KRM client, though they are serving current clients first if they can). Please call 859-226-5661 before coming and leave a message if no one picks up the phone. Their office is at 501 West 6th Street, Suite 250 (2nd floor), Lexington 40508.

KRM also offers a Walk-in Tuesday service, for humanitarian parolees, asylees, and for refugee secondary migrants (who moved here from other states). If you have one of these statuses and you have not worked with KRM before, you can now stop by the office any Tuesday from 9am-11am to learn more about benefits and services you might qualify for, and get signed up. This includes info on case management, cash assistance, adult ESL classes, youth after school and summer programs, and more. Please bring immigration documentation with you to help us determine eligibility. Immigrant victims of crime and survivors of torture (regardless of immigration status) seeking help recovering can also contact them any day, Walk-in Tuesdays or otherwise.

BANKING AND TAXES

Chase Gardenside

Gardenside location will work with you. To open an account, schedule an appointment with Spanish speaking Oscar Maldonado by calling his direct line at 859-231-0402. You must have an appointment to meet with him. Chase Gardenside is located at: 1785 Alexandria Dr, Lexington, KY 40504. The general branch phone number is: (859) 231-2554. While only Spanish is spoken here, the bank ATM works in the following languages: Chinese, French, German, Greek, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, Vietnamese. To access their website, click here.

- To open an account you MUST have the following information:
- A current passport from your country. The only exception to this is if you have a "Matricula" (Matricular Consular Card) from Mexico, Guatemala, or Honduras;
- Proof of address, such as a phone or utility bill in your name, or a pay stub;

• An ITIN number is very helpful, but not required.

There is no minimum sum required to open an account, but you will need to pay \$4,95 a month in monthly bank fees unless you deposit \$250 or more a month from your employer or government benefit providers into the account.

WIC

WIC (Women, Infants, Children program) for formula – clients need to call ahead for an appointment (859-288-2483). The office is open Monday-Thursday 8am-5pm, and open until 6:30pm on Wednesdays. Clients need to bring an ID, but it does not have to be an American ID. Clients also need to bring something that proves their current address and proof of income. Proof of income can be a letter from their employer if they do not have an SSI number, but it needs to include how much they made in the past month. They can also bring a letter from Greenhouse17, KRM, or a pay stub.

The **Public Health Clinic**, where WIC is located, is at 650 Newtown Pike. More information can be found here.

The Nest

The Nest helps families surviving domestic violence or those in need. They can offer immediate assistance once a month with baby supplies like diapers, formula, clothing, and other needs. • EPO (Emergency Protection Orders)

EPO's (Emergency Protection Orders) must be filled out in person. Call 859-246-2248 for more information. Once the EPO is filled, call 859-252-1771 to get an advocate who can help you through the process. Information in English can be found by clicking here. In Fayette County, an Emergency Protective Order can be applied for Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:00pm at Fayette Circuit Courthouse 120 N. Limestone Domestic Violence Office 4th Floor, Office C452. Monday-Friday 4:00pm-8:00am, holidays and weekends you can file at Fayette District Courthouse 150 N. Limestone Fines Room 1st Floor. There are no fees required to file and you do not need an attorney to file.

ENGLISH CLASSES / EDUCATION

• BCTC (Bluegrass Community Technical College)

BCTC offers free English campuses at its 2 Lexington Campuses. One location is at the Carnegie Center, 251 West 2nd Street, the other is at 500 Newtown Pike. All applicants MUST schedule an assessment before they can be placed in a class. To schedule an ESL assessment, click **here**.

FOOD

WIC

WIC (the Supplemental Assistance Program for Women, Infants, and Children) is a program that gives food assistance to mothers and their young children. If you are pregnant or recently gave birth to an infant, go to the WIC website to see if you are eligible for assistance here by completing the pre-screening. Note that the pre-screening is not the same as applying for WIC benefits. Children born of two parents without social security numbers can still qualify. Please note that there is a button that says "English" at the top right of the page. If you click on it, you will see a list of other languages the website is available in, which includes, among others, Spanish and Haitian Creole.

Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels is a program that offers delivery meals to people who are unable to leave their homes or prepare meals on their own, and operates out of Trinity Church in downtown Lexington but delivers throughout the city. There is a cost of \$30 per week for a lunch and dinner delivery on Monday-Friday, including holidays. God's Pantry once again accepts self-referrals. To enroll, call (859) 259-2308. Once enrolled, clients can make up to two appointments a month to pick up supplies. Walk-ins will not be assisted, **you must have an appointment**. You can call Monday through Friday, from 9am to 12pm and 1pm to 3pm. Your first pickup of the month can include household products as well as food, the second one is just for food. You must **bring photo ID** with you (it can be from a country outside the U.S.) If you speak a language other than English, please ask for an interpreter in your language and they will connect with a phone interpreter. God's Pantry has several locations and you can pick up food from whichever site is closest to you. For help in other Kentucky counties, God's Pantry lists meal programs here. Fiesta Móvil

Fiesta Móvil (Movable Feast) prepares and delivers meals five days a week to low-income people in Lexington-Fayette County who have HIV/AIDS and those under the care of Bluegrass Care Navigators (*formerly Hospice of the Bluegrass*). ITIN NUMBER - WHY GET ONE

An ITIN (Individual Tax Identification Number) is an ID number people who do not have social security numbers can use to file a tax return. The agency that collects tax money, the IRS (Internal Revenue Service) **DOES** share information with immigration.

Why get an ITIN?

- 1. It's the law you need to file taxes;
- 2. It can look good if you are applying for asylum or another kind of visa. The government will see you are someone who is following the law and trying to contribute;
- 3. It makes it much easier to open a bank account. If you have a bank account, you can deposit checks for free and you can use it to get financial assistance from some hospitals (like UK), if you have medical bills;
- 4. You could get tax benefits for your family;
- 5. In some cases, having an ITIM can help you receive some other benefits from local and state programs.

How to get an ITIN

- It takes a while to get an ITIN, don't expect to do so overnight.
- It is easiest to get an ITIN at an **ITIN Application center**. You MUST have a photo ID and call for an appointment to do so. ITIN Offices near to Lexington include:

Centenary staff only speaks English, so please make sure you have an interpreter handy if you don't speak English yourself. You will be required to provide a name and date of birth. Salvation Army

The Salvation Army is open and offers temporary housing for women, children, and families that have no place to stay. (Single men are not allowed, they need to go to the Hope Center.) The Salvation Army is located at 736 West Main Street, Lexington, KY 40508. Please call to confirm there are beds available that day before heading over (859-252-7706).

The Hope Center

The Hope Center is open and provides men who do not have a place to stay with temporary housing. Call 859-252-7881 to see if you qualify.

Catholic Action Center

The Catholic Action Center (859-255-0301) offers temporary housing to those who do not have a place to live. There are **no openings unless a resident leaves** and they are careful not to exceed capacity.

Arbor Youth Services

Arbor Youth Services is the only emergency shelter for unaccompanied children in Central Kentucky. You can call (859)254-2501 or go here for their website. Their emergency shelter serves children from birth through the age of 17 who are homeless, have been removed from their homes, have run away, or are otherwise in crisis. Youth may request shelter themselves or be referred. In addition to providing a safe place to sleep, Arbor Youth provides basic necessities such as food and clothing, as well as enhanced services including crisis counseling, case management, transportation, and youth development activities. The shelter currently accommodates 10 children and youths in their facility. To learn more, contact their Shelter Coordinator, William, at william@arborky.org. The shelter is located at 536 West Third Street, Lexington, KY 40508.

Youths aged 18 through 24 who are homeless or housing insecure can also obtain help to transition off the streets. Staff provide open center hours and appointment-based services that include access to food, clothing, hygiene supplies, information and referrals, crisis counseling, and transportation to a safe place. Youth have access to bathroom, kitchen, and laundry areas to take care of their basic living needs. They have 14 beds in this building for overnight, emergency shelter. SCHOOL INFORMATION AND ACTIVITIES

SEBT ASSISTANCE

- Some school aged children may qualify for SEBT (Summer Electronics Benefit Transfer) financial assistance. For more information, click here.
- SEBT is a Federal child nutrition program offering benefits to students from eligible families, to help cover the cost of meals during the summer when schools are not in session.
- School Aged students (aged 6 to 18 as of August 1, 2024) who have participated in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP), and/or Kinship Care for at least one month since July 1, 2024, are eligible and will automatically receive benefits.
- School aged students that do not fall into the above category but are within the income eligibility limits, can apply for SEBT benefits online. Online SEBT benefit applications can be completed by using self service capabilities or can be accessed here. This site is only available in English.

TRANSPORTATION

CRCKY

- In some limited instances, on a case to case basis, CRCKY may be able to assist in paying transportation costs for existing clients to and from doctor and hospital appointments using Uber.
- 20-ride bus passes may also be available on a case-to-case basis.

LexTran

LexTran's Community Relations Manager, Emily Elliot (859) 244-2018, offers free training on how to ride the bus for people who are not familiar with Lexington's bus system. Language access is provided, though over-the phone interpreting services in some instances, in person if in Spanish. Ms. Elliot's email is eelliott@lextran.com. Please call or email to make an appointment for a personalized lesson. She, or someone from her department, will meet you at the bus stop closest to your house, and take you to your requested destination. You can also receive a pre-printed bus route plan for how to get to other destinations in your native language, if you request it ahead of time. If you are not comfortable contacting LexTran directly, please call CRCKY to have someone request you be contacted, with an interpreter if needed. Medicaid

Medicaid Related Transportation assistance is available as noted below:

- Individuals who have Medicaid are eligible to receive free transportation to and from medical appointments with Medicaid Providers.
- o Individuals in Bourbon, Clark, Estill, **Fayette**, Harrison, Madison, Nicholas, and Powell counties can call 1-888-848-0989 or 859-233-0066 to schedule a pickup with Federated Transportation Services of the Bluegrass (FTSB) to schedule transportation. Individuals in Anderson, Boyle, Franklin, Garrard, Jessamine, Lincoln, Mercer, Scott, and Woodford counties can call 1-800-456-6588 or 502-695-4290 to schedule transportation.
- Spanish is available as an option when you dial in. For all other languages, you must navigate the phone system to speak with a live representative before you can request an interpreter.
- o The Medicaid member or someone helping them must call to schedule the NEMT ride at least 3 days, but not more than 30 days, before the appointment. So note that if an appointment is on Wednesday, and the office is closed on Sunday, the ride would need to be scheduled before Saturday at 1.

o Riders MUST have a valid Kentucky Medicaid card, be going to a Medicaid related service, and not have access to a car. Riders 55 and older will receive door to door car service. Riders under 55 will only be provided door to door car service if they live more than a half mile from a bus stop, or a qualified doctor writes a note explaining why the Medicaid member cannot ride the bus.
