Professor Richard R. Day is the Chairman of the Department of Second Language Studies, College of Languages, Linguistics, and Literature, University of Hawai'i. His areas of specialization include second language reading, second language teacher education, curriculum design, and materials development. Dr. Day is a co-editor of Reading in a Foreign Language and is Chairman and co-founder of the Extensive Reading Foundation.

Professor Day recently completed work on a three-level reading course for Oxford University Press, *Cover to Cover*. One of the unique features of *Cover to Cover* is the integration of reading strategies, vocabulary development, and extensive reading.

During Oxford Press' Book Day, he was the plenary speaker, explaining what Extensive Reading is and introducing his new textbook series.

While he has written numerous articles and book chapters, his most influential publications are on extensive reading. Professor Day was the co-author, with Julian Bamford, of Extensive Reading in the Second Language Classroom (Cambridge University Press), which helped draw attention to extensive reading. Bamford and he later edited Extensive Reading Activities for Teaching Language (also published by Cambridge), a collection of 106 activities that are concerned with extensive reading.
