1. What are your most popular majors?
2. What kind of grants or scholarships do you offer transfer students?
3. What kind of support programs do you offer to help assist me with my academic success?
4. What are the housing options and meal plans at your campus?
5. What was the transition from community college to \_\_\_\_\_ University?
6. Why did you select this school?
7. What do you love the most about his school?
8. What is your least favorite thing?
9. How is the food in the dining hall?
10. What are some of the companies graduates from your college are working with now?
11. What percentage of students graduate within four years? In five years?
12. What sets your school apart from other HBCUs?
13. What would be your most important advice to an incoming transfer student?
14. Are the students approachable?
15. What makes this college special?
16. What big issues are being debated on campus? (look at newspapers and posters)

17. How reliable is the campus wi-fi?
18. What are the dorms like?
19. Would you suggest transfer students live on campus?
20. What is the relationship like between the college and the surrounding community
21. How far away from the academic buildings are the dorms?
22. Do students help evaluate professors?
23. What can you learn about school spirit and support of a team you might be a part of?

40. Are there any particular tensions on campus?
41. Is there anything special I should see before I leave the campus?
42. If you were to do it all over again, would you still choose this college?
43. Can you tell me about any recent campus initiatives or projects that aren't widely publicized yet?
44. What is the student culture like on weekends? Are there particular traditions or activities that students commonly engage in?
45. Are there any unique or unconventional academic programs or opportunities available to students?

46. What are some common misconceptions about the college that you'd like to clarify?
47. Are there any local community partnerships or service opportunities that students frequently participate in?
48. Can you talk about any recent changes or developments on campus that have had a significant impact on student life?
49. Can you describe the relationship between students and professors outside of the classroom?
50. What is the relationship like between the college and the surrounding community?
51. How do students typically spend their free time on campus? Off campus?
52. Can you describe the relationship between students and professors outside of the classroom?
53. Can you provide examples of how the college supports students in their career development and job placement after graduation?
54. Can you share some insights into the housing options available for students, and what the dorm life is like?

55. What support services are available for first-generation college students or students from underrepresented backgrounds?
56. Can you share any notable instances where alumni have made significant contributions to society, and how does the college maintain connections with its graduates?
57. What measures does the college take to ensure a supportive and inclusive environment for LGBTQ+ students?
58. Can you discuss any recent academic or campus expansions or renovations?
59. What is the relationship like between the college and the surrounding community?
