About this week's choral music...

The traditional hymn texts printed in this bulletin may be altered to be more inclusive and, in some cases, to eliminate so-called archaic language. Original texts can be found in the pew hymnal.

Introit: O God, the King of glory (Henry Purcell, 1659–1695)

O God, the King of glory is one of Purcell's earliest surviving full anthems, written in the 'old', largely homophonic style that had been prevalent in churches and chapels throughout Britain for many years. Purcell's setting was composed by February 1679 and survives in the Gostling part-books now held in the library of York Minster. In this brief work, probably written for performance before the Collect for the Sunday after Ascension, the composer's youthful individuality surfaces in the divergent chromaticism of 'leave us not comfortless'.

Offertory Anthem: Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace (Samuel S. Wesley, 1810–1876)

Samuel Sebastian Wesley was a towering figure in the history of English cathedral music. No other composer between Purcell and Stanford came close to his achievement. He was a son of Samuel Wesley, another important composer of sacred music, and a grandson of Charles Wesley, the great hymn writer and one of the founders of Methodism. 'Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace' was composed around 1850, and is one of Wesley's better-known works and has been performed on many state occasions, including the coronation of Elizabeth II in 1953. The lyrics were taken from Isaiah 26:3, Psalm 139:11, I John 1:5b, Psalm 119:175a and Matthew 6:13.

Bjarne Sløgedal (1927–2014) - *Variations on the Norwegian folk tune "Oh how glorious it shall be"*

Bjarne Sløgedal was a Norwegian organist, conductor and composer. After finishing his exam in church music at the conservatory of music in Oslo, he continued his studies at the Juilliard School of Music in New York. The variations over *Å hvor salig det skal blive* is a piece written over a traditional Norwegian folk melody from the valley of Setesdal, a rural and historical area in southern Norway. The piece consists of five short variations: I, *Koral*, II *Song*, III *Fløyteljud* (sound of the flute), IV *Langleik* and V *Frygde song* (song of joy). The fourth variation takes inspiration from the traditional Norwegian instrument Langleik, considered to be the national instrument of the country next to the Hardanger fiddle. The text

for the hymn is written by the Swedish lay preacher Svenning Johansson and is a great example of Scandinavian pietism, and talks about the christian hope of eternal rest. Here is the translation of the first and last verse of the hymn:

“Oh how glorious it shall be for God’s children to return home. No one might describe the joy, to live in God’s heaven. Behold Jesus, behold him, as he gathers his own to our home.

Be bold, you shall win the way to the home of rest! Hold Jesus in your mind, raise your gaze to heaven: Jesus is coming, yes, he is coming soon and will bring his own to our home.”

The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul was built in 1931-32. Two congregations, St. Andrew's founded in 1803, and St. Paul's founded in 1832, joined together in 1919. This is the Regimental

Church of The Black Watch (Royal Highland Regiment) of Canada, whose colours hang in the sanctuary. The church organ is a four-manual 1932 Casavant (completely rebuilt in 2000) with 112 ranks and 7000 pipes spread over eight divisions, located in the chancel and the gallery.
