NI grant extension: questions for New Incentives

- We are trying to reconstruct why, in 2017, we under-estimated the amount you needed to support operations during the RCT and in the event of a negative decision on the top-charity status. Our understanding is that, in November 2017, you thought the top-charity decision would be made by April 30th, and you would have two weeks 'buffer' before starting to use exit funds on May 15th.¹ However, (a) the top-charity decision will arrive later than you expected and (b) you now estimate you would need one month 'buffer' (rather than two weeks).
 - Is this right? If not, could you share your reconstruction of what happened?
- You mentioned you would need a 'buffer' month between a negative decision and phase out, to agree on an exit strategy with stakeholders.² We'd like to understand this stage better.
 - If the reconstruction above is right, why have you updated your estimate on the amount of 'buffer' time needed?
 - What activities would you conduct during this month? Which stakeholders would you involve?
 - What are the downsides or costs of not doing this work?
 - o Is there any of this work that you could do ahead of a funding decision?
 - Our understanding is that you expect the cost of maintaining operations during that month to be \$253,054 (i.e. the same as the cost of maintaining operations while GiveWell completes the evaluation.)³ Is this right? If not, could you share a budget for this month?

- Your recent budget suggests costs per month are ~25% higher than you expected in 2017.⁴
 - Does this lead to an increase in the total cost of the phase out (i.e. higher than the \$634,660 estimated in 2017)?
 - If so, could you share a new budget for the phase out?
- We're planning to recommend that a grant, assuming we make it, be disbursed to you by May 15. Does that work for you, or would you recommend a different timeline?
