## **Station 1:**

### **Instructions for student**

Scenario Kelly Smith is a 22-year-old woman who has been referred by her GP. Her mother is concerned that she should be eating more, and she is worried about her daughter's weight.

### **Candidate Instructions:**

1. Take an appropriate history from the patient
2. At 6 minutes, the examiner will ask you some questions.

## **Station 2:**

### **Instructions for student**

You are an intern in the emergency department and have been asked to see Douglas, a 56-year-old male who has presented after vomiting blood.

### **Instructions:**

1. Take a focused history from the patient
2. At six minutes the examiner will stop and ask you questions

## **Station 3:**

### **Instructions for student**

Parker is a 27 year old woman who presents to you at the early pregnancy assessment clinic. Yesterday she experienced vaginal bleeding and cramping and presented to the Emergency Department where she was diagnosed with an incomplete miscarriage via ultrasound and bHCG. Parker is aware of this outcome and has come to you today to discuss her management options.

### **Tasks**

1. Take a brief focussed history from Parker.
2. Explain her management options.
3. Counsel her on the outcome of her pregnancy.

## **Station 4**

### **Instructions for student**

Vanessa is a 32 years old G2P1 woman who is currently 26 weeks gestation. Her previous pregnancy was delivered via an emergency cesarean section due to fetal distress in 2020. She has come in today to discuss options for a vaginal delivery for her second child. Counsel her on what options are available for her, including the benefits/ risks and answer any questions she may have.

**Her recent ultrasound findings are:** Single male intrauterine pregnancy

**Placenta position:** anterior, 40mm from cervix

**Estimated fetal weight:** 50th percentile

**Presentation:** Frank breech
