Mercy Values

CHaSERS is our school-wide home learning programme which focuses on our Mercy Values. This was created to provide our students with learning experiences around each of these Mercy Values:

Compassion

Special Character of St Thomas Aquinas School

Religious Education

Religious Education is taught in every classroom. Children go to a class Mass every two weeks and will mark liturgical year celebrations with a whole school Mass. Prayers are held daily in the classroom and school prayers are held every fortnight.

Sacramental Programme offered in school

Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Penance (or Sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession) is for spiritual healing. Catholics believe Jesus left the Sacrament of Penance because only God's grace can heal a wounded soul.

After you confess your sins, the priest gives you a penance to perform. This may be doing something nice for others and/or a set of prayers, such as saying the Our Father or the Hail Mary, a certain number of times.

Confirmation

This sacrament is called Confirmation because the faith given in Baptism is now confirmed and made strong. The focus is on the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles on Pentecost and gave them courage to practise their faith. Catholics believe that the same Holy Spirit confirms Catholics during the Sacrament of Confirmation and gives them the same gifts and fruits.

Holy Communion

The Holy Eucharist is food for the soul, so it's given and eaten during Holy Communion at the Mass. When you receive Holy Communion, you're intimately united with Jesus Christ — he literally becomes part of you. Also, by taking Holy Communion, you express your union with all Catholics who believe the same doctrines, obey the same laws, and follow the same leaders.

Buses

Children are able to come to school on the bus each morning and go home each afternoon. After school, bus children are picked up by one bus which takes them to

Central Southland College where the students get onto their respective bus. Bus routes are available from school, or by phoning Go Buses on (03) 236 7921.

It is **extremely important** that the school is informed by phoning the office (by 2.30pm) or sending a note if your child is **NOT** to travel on their bus on a particular day.

Calendar

Cellphones

Pupils are not permitted cell phones at school. If they (cell phones) are brought, please hand them in to the teacher and they can be picked up by the child at 2:50 pm.

Dental Clinic

The school dental service is based at Winton Primary School. Families will receive a phone call from the dental clinic regarding your child's appointment. Should you have any concerns over your child's teeth you are able to contact the clinic at any time on 03 236 7104.

Catholic Dues

The school 'dues' are a fee that is discussed with you by the parish priest. This is dealt with by the Dunedin Diocese.

Health Nurse

The Public Health Nurse visits the school on a regular basis. If you have any queries regarding your child's health you may make an appointment to see her through the school office.

High Vis Vests

Each child is allocated a high vis vest when they start school. This is to be worn to and from school and when going on school trips or camps.

Internet Safety Use

We ask that parents sign an internet safety agreement if they wish to have their children use the internet and web while at St Thomas Aquinas School. We go over the safeguards with the children regularly.

Library

Each class has weekly library sessions. A maximum of two books is allowed at any one time. Overdue books will incur a fee if not required after two weeks being overdue.

Parents will receive an email when the books are overdue.

Lost Property

Lost property is stored in a basket near the first aid area in the administration area. It is important that all school uniform items are named. At the end of term any uncollected lost property is donated to charity.

Medication

If a child is to be given prescription drugs during school time parents must fill out an appropriate form. The medication is kept by the school office manager. It is distributed by a designated person, at the appropriate time of the day.

New Families

Each new family will be allocated a buddy family to support them in their transition to our school.

Notices

All notices and important information is posted on HERO. It is important that all families are signed up for HERO and check it regularly.

PTA (Parent and Teacher Association)

We extend a warm welcome to all parents and caregivers of children to our school. Our aim, as a PTA, is to encourage interaction between parents, teachers and the community. We are responsible for some fundraising for specific purposes within our school during the year to support learning within our school.

Reporting to parents

Learner Conferences are held at the end of Term 2 for children in year 3-8. This is an opportunity for students, parents and teachers to discuss learning. A mid year data sheet is given out at this conference. A report is given out at the end of Term 4.

Year 0-3 students will receive a report to show children's progress on their half and full birthday anniversaries. Please note Year 0-3 students will only be reported on at these times.
