Come and find out how you can be a contributor to the English (UK) locale tomorrow (Wednesday 30 September 2020) as part of the global celebrations for International Translation Day. Mark Scott Robson (@markscottrobson), one of the one of Locale Managers and GTEs for en\_GB, will be hosting a drop-in session between 11am - 12pm UTC/12pm - 1pm BST on the polyglots-events channel on the Make WordPress Slack.

The locale team members are up to date with core, meta and apps, and they clear all waiting and fuzzy strings on a daily basis. They have even translated all strings relating to the WordPress 5.5.1 release. They would like more contributors to translate the most popular plugins and themes.

There are 245 current translation contributors, 10 General Translation Editors (GTEs) and 30 Project Translation Editors (PTEs). The English (UK) locale has been going since about 2011. The team would like to complete translations of the top 200 plugins and themes.
