It pushes us to sift through the fluff of all the literature that's out there to spot the truly valuable insights. You're critically evaluating what's in front of you, summarizing key points, and figuring out how it all might connect and inform your designated track team's design efforts. Ultimately, this exercise is intended to sharpen your analytical skills and deepen your understanding of what makes a learning experience for your topic truly impactful.

In many ways, this ABib is the foundation upon which your lessons/workshops will be built. By taking this first step with our teams we are essentially laying the groundwork for creating something that could change the way people learn and that has true in-person impact when it's carried out by Instructors on the Conectadoverse with its users.
