NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the ISSA Procedural Rules, and the NWISA District Rules.
- 1.2. The US Sailing prescriptions to rule 60, 63.2 and 63.4 are deleted and will not apply.
- 1.3. Under rule 70.5(a), the right of appeal is denied.
- 1.4. Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, as modified by ISSA Procedural Rule 14(c) will be in effect.
- 1.5. FJ class rules will not apply.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1. This is an Open Regatta (& clinic format) as described in the NWISA District Rules. 'Active' and 'Mixed' teams may attend.

3. FORMAT

- 3.1. Clinic will take place on Saturday, October 28th.
 - 3.1.1. The clinic portion of the event will focus on the basics of team racing and on the water drills and races.
 - 3.1.2. Coaches attending the regatta will provide onshore and on water instruction.
 - 3.1.3. Three coach boats will be provided by AWA for coaches to use during the clinic.
- 3.2. The regatta will take place on Sunday, October 29th
 - 3.2.1. The regatta portion of the event will be a 3 vs 3 bracket.
- 3.3. At the discretion of coaches, this regatta/clinic can be converted to a fleet race clinic/regatta.
- 3.4. Teams shall be composed of three boats (6 sailors). Halloween themed teams will be assigned at random and announced during Saturday's party.
- 3.5. Racing will be run on a digital "N" course
- 3.6. Teams shall be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.

4. ENTRY AND ENTRY FEE:

- 4.1. All North regional NWISA teams are encouraged to participate. If you need assistance with boats, registration, or have questions about the regatta please contact the regatta host or district representative.
- 4.2. Eligible schools shall register through the NWISA website link. Registration is on a first come, first served basis if berths are limited. Registration opens October 16th at 1100.
- 4.3. Registration closes October 23rd at 2200. Additional registrations are allowed after this time, but teams may be turned away if event capacity is reached.

- 4.4. Teams unable to compete once registration closes, shall notify the regatta chair as soon as possible.
- 4.5. Each competitor must have a signed AWA waiver on file. Please complete a waiver for each competitor here: <https://forms.gle/DaVzdWW5vV9b2YnX6>
- 4.6. An entry fee of \$5 per sailor payable to: “Anacortes Waterfront Alliance ” will be collected at check in. Teams can request to pay by credit card prior to the event.

5. END OF SEASON CELEBRATION & COSTUME CONTEST

- 5.1. After the clinic on Saturday AWA will be hosting an end of season celebration at the Seafarers Park Building from 4:30PM- 6:30PM
- 5.2. High School and Middle School Sailors, Parents and Coaches are invited to participate
- 5.3. Potluck, games and costume contest
 - 5.3.1. There is fridge and freezer space available for potluck food to be stored during the day Saturday.

6. BOATS AND FORMAT:

- 6.1. This regatta will be sailed in FJs.
- 6.2. Teams should plan to bring necessary boats to accommodate our 3 vs 3 bracket. Please communicate with Regatta Chair Elise Murphy

7. SCHEDULE:

Saturday, October 28th

0930	Check in at Seafarers Park Building, unload and rig boats
1030	Clinic will commence in the Seafarers Park Building
1530	Sailing & Clinic will end at approximately 3:30pm
1630	End of Season Celebration - potluck, games, costume contest at the Seafarers Park Building

Sunday, October 29th

0900	Report Time at Seafarers Park
0945	Skipper Meeting in front of Seafarers Park Building
1030	First warning
1530	No race will be started after this time.
1600	Awards after boats are put away

8. RACING AREA:

- 8.1.** Boats will be rigged and staged at Seafarers Park: 601 Seafarers Parkway, Anacortes WA 98221.
- 8.2.** All races will be sailed outside of the Seafarers Park breakwater.
- 8.3.** Boat rotations will occur from the Seafarers Park dock.

9. COACHING:

- 9.1. Coaches are encouraged to be afloat during the regatta to help with coaching during the clinic and to help with mark sets and umpiring during the regatta.

10. Drones

- 10.1.** The use of drones is expressly prohibited, as stated in ISSA Procedural Rule 5.2.

11. CONDUCT

- 11.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841.
- 11.2. Infringements of this regulation and/or other inappropriate conduct occurring during the regatta, may be the basis for a hearing under RRS 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing shall, at a time and place selected by it, meet to hear said protest, and it may impose scoring penalties, or other sanctions that it deems appropriate, including summary removal from the regatta.
