Marquese Averett (Fuse) Demystifying canvassing

- Canvassing in your own neighborhood
- allows for us to gather data that we wouldn't normally get.
- 10 times better than making phone calls. More effective. Phone only reach 7% of people, the best way is to knock on doors.

- program called miniVAN is used. Its on your phone tells you what house exactly to knock on. Gives you script to use.
- very user friendly, automatic, easy to use, collects data for you.
- script is not the most important part, you use it as a guide to have conversations and really listen to people's concerns.
- Fuse, WA Dems will train you, and give you extra training if you want it.
- Working with a partner is much more fun
- You can volunteer to just be a driver if you don't want to/can't go door to door

Google Drive

- Topic Groups each have a folder where all their documents and information can be stored.
- o If you have, or get a gmail account and it is more user friendly.
- Can use even if you don't have a gmail account

Slack

- like a group chat, but organized by conversation, or channel. Each channel has its own purpose such as "events" or "social media" or a specific topic group.
- channels, topic groups, you can see conversations of things that have happened before, so if someone new joins, they can look back at what's been discussed.
- Very transparent.
- App for Phone and Desktop, or can use web page
- Set notifications so you know when something new has happened.
- Steering committee uses every day.
