EVEXIA is a San Francisco-based group of graduate students and postdocs whose mission is to build an interactive community of scientists that share an interest in life sciences investing. We apply our deep understanding of biology and medicine to identify value in biotech investment opportunities.

Program Information

Our flagship activity is the Analyst Training Program (ATP). ATP is a short but intense program designed to equip scientists with the necessary tools to evaluate publicly traded biotech companies as potential investments. Participants will learn from experienced EVEXIA members how to identify undervalued biotech investments, then synthesize that information into a cohesive investment pitch to the EVEXIA community. The process of constructing this presentation will involve scientific and financial due diligence, analysis of clinical trial data, evaluation of financial statements, and review of competitive intelligence. ATP coaches and other EVEXIA members will help guide you through this process. Joining an ATP cycle is a great way to learn more about EVEXIA and grow your connections to the Bay Area Life Sciences Investing Community!

Time Commitment

The training cycle is set to begin on October 29th and continue until the end of January. Applicants should expect to dedicate ~5-10 hours per week over a 3-month period. Time will be split between individual study, meeting with peers, and meetings with ATP coaches. Each applicant is expected to participate for the duration of the program and attend monthly EVEXIA meetings.

Application materials include...

- 1.) **Cover letter** (*why are you interested in ATP/EVEXIA? Your background?; 1-2 paragraphs MAX*)
- 2.) **Resume or CV** (*Optional*)
- 3.) **Pick a small- to mid-cap public company in the life sciences space and write a one-page 'pitch'** of why EVEXIA should consider investing in that company. Include the following:
 - A. A 5-10 bullet or sentence summary of why this company should be explored for further investment. Consider factors beyond the science (i.e. competition, unmet needs, etc.)
 - B. 3-6 bullets or sentences highlighting some of the risks of investing in this company
 - C. A concise 2-3 sentence summary outlining your "thesis" of why you think this company is undervalued and worth exploring further for investment

Note: There are no right answers and an exhaustive analysis is unnecessary; we just want to learn how you might approach a potential investment!
