Alvin R. Kelley Dies at Residence, Was Ill for Years

Alvin R. Kelley, 67, of 84 Elmwood Ct., died at 7 a.m. today at his home after an extended illness.

Mr. Kelley was born in Oshkosh May 16, 1890 and lived here all his life. He attended Oshkosh High School and graduated from an extension course in business given by the University of Wisconsin after which he was in the stocks and bonds field until his illness.

A veteran of World War I, Mr. Kelley was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church, the Knights of Columbus and the American Legion. In September of 1939 he married Miss Marie Bauer, who survives.

Also surviving are two daughters, Cheryl Kay and Carol Lynn, and a sister, Mrs. Daisy Barney, all of Oshkosh. A brother, William, and two sisters, Mrs. Clara Patterson and Sr. M. Alicia, preceded him in death.
