When should I book my senior session?

It is best to schedule your college senior session about a month before graduation. This allows plenty of time for you to receive your full gallery, and then curate and send your announcements before you walk the stage! For winter grads, this means you should inquire in October to schedule your session for November. Summer graduates may want to begin the process a bit earlier since this is a busy season - think March.

Do you help with posing?

I have years of experience posing individuals and couples alike to feel elevated and natural. Throughout your session, I'll provide gentle guidance and subtle direction to create an organically styled feel. No stiff or cliche posing, just an authentic version of you.

Can you help me pick outfits or choose a location?

Absolutely! After your session is booked, share the vision you have for your grad photos and a little bit about your experience as an Aggie. I'll provide resources to guide you, and then I'll help refine your options using my years of expertise styling and capturing memorable milestones.

Your time in college is coming to a close, and now it's time to sum it up in an outfit (or two). As trends come and go, finding the balance between stylish and classic can be hard. But as a grad photographer in College Station, I will guide you in picking out the best grad photo outfits.

How many grad photo outfits should you choose?

If there is enough time during your session, I recommend having at least two outfits set aside for your graduation photos. This way, you can choose a more classic look, and then another outfit with more flair. Your first option should be a formal or polished look, and your second option can feel more casual.

For kicks, use your cap and gown for a third outfit!

Where to shop for graduation picture outfits

To find a classic, but unique ensemble for your grad photo outfits, check out local boutiques. These stores will have curated collections of stylish pieces, and oftentimes have plenty of options to match your school colors! <u>Sabi Boutique</u>, <u>Hemline</u>, and <u>J&L Boutique</u> are some of the best boutiques in College Station.

Or, while you're on spring break in a new city, check out their shops.

Pro tip: if you care about local businesses or small mom-and-pops, avoid the Amazon add-to-cart shopping for this.

What to wear for graduation pictures: dressy looks

You can't go wrong with a dress! Fitted silhouettes and dainty details can be super flattering against the boxy fit of your graduation regalia. One of the most important considerations,

however, is length. You'll want the dress to be long enough so that you can comfortably move around during your photo session. But if you feel more comfortable in a romper or trousers, I absolutely recommend going in that direction. In the end, it's all about choosing what feels most true to you!

What colors to wear for formal grad photos

For color options, matching your school's colors is the way to go (just don't blend in so much that it looks blasé)! Here at TAMU, maroon and white are perfect, but black and cream are good options too. You can also wear complementary colors to help your stole stand out! Solid colors or simple patterns are ideal for a more timeless and classic look. These show up best in photos and keep the focus on you and your amazing accomplishments!

Shoes for formal graduation photos

Comfort is key! A&M is a *big* campus (as you know!), so choosing shoes that you can comfortably walk in is key if we're taking photos on site. Heels with a thicker block can make walking across campus easier. But if you have your heart set on a beautiful pair of pumps, bring an extra pair of walking shoes just in case!

Tips For Senior Photos: Preparing for a Successful Grad Session

Find inspiration

If you have a distinct vision for your graduation photos, sharing your inspiration will be the best way to ensure your photographer can fulfill it. And you can find inspiration from so many places — Instagram, fellow classmates, your favorite creators, movies, and art. I've found that the easiest way to gather and share these ideas is through Pinterest.

Start by looking at posing and photography styles that you like to establish the overall vision for your session. Then, find more specific inspiration for things like location, wardrobe, and props.

Here are a few helpful questions to ask yourself when choosing the vision for your senior photos:

- How do I want to feel when I look back at these photos?
- What about my college experience do I want to remember and celebrate most?
- Do I want to feel styled and posed or natural and candid?

Looking and feeling your best

One of the best recommendations I can give you in preparing for your senior session is to avoid making any drastic changes to your appearance in the days before your session. Book any haircuts, tans, eyelash extensions, etc., 1-2 weeks before your photos. And when you do, avoid changing things up too much. This way you'll feel true to yourself and comfortable in a look that you are familiar with.

In the days leading up to your session, it's best to:

- Drink plenty of water, your skin will thank you!
- Practice any hair or makeup styles you want to wear for your session.
- Get your manicure and pedicure (neutral colors are usually an easy yes!)

Choosing a wardrobe you'll love

After you've found some guiding lights on Pinterest, start gathering your wardrobe pieces. Choose something that is comfortable, stylish, and most of all, authentic to you. I recommend having 2-3 ensembles, then confirming with your photographer which options will be best. A good grad photographer will have insights into which patterns, colors, and silhouettes will photograph best and stand up to time.

More tips to consider for your grad photo outfits:

- Choose colors that complement your skin tone and your school colors
- Your outfits can be dressy or casual (I recommend curating options for both!)
- Avoid large logos (unless it's your school's!)

Tips for Senior Pictures: The Day Before & Day of Your Session

From beginning to end, there are some key tips to make sure your session goes as smoothly as possible!

Prepping the night before

- Double-check your wardrobe choices for any stains or stray tags
- Take care of any wrinkles and iron your clothes
- Gather your chosen props in one place, including cap and gown, stoles, and class rings
- Moisturize and hydrate! Keep your skin happy and healthy!
- Get plenty of rest, you'll be happy to have the energy

The morning of your senior photos

- Set aside plenty of time to get ready, you don't want to feel rushed
- While you get ready, put on your favorite playlist to set the tone!
- Avoid wearing tight-fitting clothing or accessories (like an Apple Watch) that might leave an indent on your skin
- Eat a meal that will keep you satisfied, but avoid foods you know will make you feel sluggish or bloated.

What to bring to your senior session:

- Comfortable shoes (especially if all your outfits are paired with heels!)
- Photo props
- Wrinkle release spray (you can usually find travel-sized bottles at your local grocery store!)
- Hairspray, a brush, and extra hairpins
- Touch-up makeup, like powder and lip color
- Additional outfit options
- A confident mindset (have fun!)!

The Best Senior Portrait Locations at TAMU

Kyle Field

You know it and love it; this iconic fixture of TAMU campus has been the epicenter of endless memories for countless fellow Aggies. From your first days at Fish camp to your final yell during football season — a few casual photos in front of this landmark will help commemorate it all. I love taking a few photos here with your favorite gameday getup — think a maroon jersey and your trusty cowboy boots.

The Academic Building

With over a century of history, this Neoclassical building is one of the most beautiful on campus. From the copper dome to the spacious rotunda to the ionic columns, this building's architecture creates a timeless atmosphere that is the perfect backdrop for some dressed-up grad photos.

The Gardens

For early spring grad photos, there couldn't be a better location than the Gardens on campus. Covering seven acres of land, these gardens include everything from butterfly gardens, fragrant

Creative Graduation Portrait Ideas

It isn't easy to sum up the years of hard work and dedication into a few photos, but these graduation portrait ideas can help you have a fun session and imagery full of meaning.

Champagne pop

What better way to celebrate four years of hard work than with a classic champagne pop! Grab a bottle of your favorite bubbles and bring it along for the session. Your photographer will direct you about the best way to shake and open the bottle. Though, keep in mind that this can get a little messy, so it's best to save this idea for the end of your session to avoid staining your clothes.

2. Extracurricular activities

Whether you were the president of your sorority, a member of your school's honor society, or a star volleyball player, the people you met and experiences you had through your organizations played an important role in your time at TAMU. Honor your extracurricular activities in your grad photos with props or at a location that encapsulates your involvement.

3. Include your friends, family or significant other

Your support system is what helped you get through those difficult finals seasons and stressful classes. Including them in your graduation portraits is a beautiful way to honor them too (with your photographer's permission!). Whether it's your solid friend group, your college sweetheart

or your supportive family, take some time during your session to celebrate with them. I love capturing these special bonds during senior photos!

Photos Props for Graduation

I love encouraging my seniors to bring a few props to add a bit of character and dynamic poses.

Your cap, gown, stoles and cords

These are a must! Your graduation regalia will be the most important prop needed for your session. Don't forget these (and make sure they're ironed and wrinkle-free before your session)!

Class ring

Show off that glittering symbol of your time as an Aggie throughout your session.

Your dog!

Our furry family members are such an important part of our support system. Bring your pup decked out in Aggie gear for a sweet moment during your session.

12th Man Towel

This is a great addition to your casual look. Twirl it proudly in front of Kyle Field to honor all the Aggie yells as the 12th man.

Gear from your extracurricular activity or major

Whether it's a gavel for your time as sorority president, a stethoscope to represent your pre-med studies, or a hard hat for your engineering experience, a prop to symbolize your interests while at TAMU is a great way to add some personality to your photos.

Posing for Graduation Photos

Before your session, let your photographer know the vision you have for your graduation portraits. A good grad photographer will be able to naturally direct and pose you for beautiful results. But if you still need some inspiration, these are some of my favorite poses for graduation photos.

Over the shoulder

Facing away from the camera, take your stole in your left hand and fold it in half. Place the stole over your left shoulder, take a step with your right foot and look back at the camera with your body at a slight angle.

I love styling this pose down scenic walkways or up a grand stairway. It's a great way to show off your stole and any additional regalia that display your achievements.

Toss the cap

This one is a classic for a reason! With your dominant hand, hold your cap at the corner down by your waist. In one motion, throw the cap up in the air (with a little bit of force, but not too much) and keep your arm up until the cap falls to the ground. You can either look up at your cap or smile at the camera.

For a little bit of extra playfulness, you can even pop one of your feet up. The movement and joy that this pose portrays make it an all-time favorite.

The elegant sit

Seated on either a step or bench, turn your body at a 45-degree angle. With your legs slightly bent in front of you, cross your front ankle in front of the other. Lean back on your front hand and softly place your other hand across your body, on top of your front thigh. Now smile! This pose creates some of the best headshots of your session.

Pro tip: try to gently point your feet. This will lengthen and add a bit more elegance to the pose!

Find the right location

As a photographer, trust me when I say that the right location can make all the difference in your imagery. From the lighting to backdrops to the atmosphere, where you take your graduation portraits can have a big impact on the results. That's why it is so important to do your research and collaborate closely with your grad photographer. They will likely know some of the best photo locations on campus, then guide you in the right direction.

Embrace unique locations

Be intentional about the locations you do choose. Don't just settle on the same location everyone else went to. Think about spots on campus or around town that mean the most to you. Where did you study the most? Which building did you spend the most time in? Which walkway was your favorite place to catch up with friends? Don't be afraid to recommend these meaningful locations to your photographer — they can help you decide if the setting is right for your photos.

What to Wear For Senior Pictures

As a grad photographer, I like to recommend choosing at least two outfits for your session. This way, you can have both a classic dressy option, as well as a more casual and personality-filled ensemble. However, depending on your session length, there may be time for more. Talk with your photographer to see their recommendations based on your session length and the locations you choose.

Silhouettes and styles

Think about both comfort and style. If you choose a dress or skirt, make sure it's long enough so moving throughout your session is comfortable. But if you prefer a jumpsuit, romper, or trousers, go for it. The best recommendation overall is to wear what feels authentic to you!

What colors to wear for senior photos

When choosing your outfits, consider colors that complement your features and your school's colors. Ensure that at least one of your outfits coordinates well with your graduation regalia, then have fun with the other! Opt for solid colors or simple patterns — these will photograph best.


To avoid any delays in traffic, please:

 - 2. Manually submit each blog post. Use this tutorial!

This is how we notify Google of new content, and get it to show up on search engine results even faster!

3. Bonus: Share on Instagram, add to Pinterest and send in a newsletter!

FAQs



01. HOW SOON SHOULD I PUBLISH?

The earlier you post these, the earlier the results can roll in! Try not to delay as we wrote these based on recent research, which will perform best if posted within 4-6 weeks.

02. SHOULD I POST IN ANY PARTICULAR ORDER?

We typically write them in the order of ideal posting! The only reason the order matters is if we link from one post to another — you'll need to then go in and update the URL to go to the live blog post!

03. IS IT BEST TO PUBLISH ALL AT ONCE OR SPREAD IT OUT?

We suggest scheduling out publications to once per week or twice a week until they're all live! If you're in WordPress, you can schedule this in advance.
