Presentation:

Q: How do they get the food?

F.25.19 WPI Golf Club (\$10660)--PASSED IN AMENDED AMOUNT

Presentation:

Funding for practices/tournaments. President presenting. Provide space for play.

Practice Fees green hill golf course 6x on course 6x on range 1940. Tournament fee 2960.

Tournament 2 fees 2800, tournament 3 fees 2960. Tryouts were used to determine who goes. A and B team. Can fit everyone at least once.

Questions:

Q: Is the tournament fee counted as registration fee?

F.25.20 WPI Club Pickleball (\$7240)--PASSED

Presentation:

100+ people at A term GBM. 90+ at first practice. 40+ people at each practice since. Great relationship with Rt.12 Pickle. Requesting money to fund weekly off campus practice. Events are open to all of campus. Room for additional nets in the locker. This was approved by Ann. Courts: 45 x 156 Hours = 7020. Better rate this year than last year. Net x 120 x 2 = 240. Net repair 30 x 2 = 60. No gym credit this year, but for BCD term we will be able to get PE credit. Total is 7320.

Questions:

Q: How many active members?

A: About 70.

Q: How is practice done?

A: Designated drivers. Sign up sheets for practices. Up to 20 people, just because then it would be unmanageable. Wednesday nights are practices.

Q: Is the future plan that all 20 spots would be PE credit?

A: I would hope not, just because playing is fun. Have a coach but no PE credit. Wouldn't just want the same 20 people playing every single week. Would like to switch it up.

Q: What is the invoice for?

A: For the whole year. Weekly practices. 24 weeks.

Q: Whose are the nets?

A: The club's. We keep them safely stored.

Discussion:

FOR: Reactively low cost and it is good that they are able to go off campus.

FOR: Fits the purpose of the club.

FOR: Keeping their nets in good repair.

Outcome: Passed in full.

F.25.21 Badminton Club (\$161.94)--PASSED IN AMENDED AMOUNT

Presentation:

Badminton Equipment FR. 60 PE Credit members. 80 weekly active members. 270 total members. Weekly play times. Competitive tournaments. Campus tournaments. Basketball sticky board. Reduces injury chance. Better quality play. Helps with better form. Total is 19.99. Tripods. Record games for post game reviews. For all playable courts so all players can get game footage. 32.99 for one. 131.96 for all four.. Whiteboard. 16" x 12" double sided whiteboard. Used to help with team meetings with visual illustrations and strategy planning. Total is 9.99. Total cost is 161.94.

Questions:

Q: How long does the sticky board last?

A: About 30 sheets. Works well. One of the members has used it before.

Q: Have you reached out to ATC instead of looking to buy your own?

A: We go to a lot of tournaments. Flexibility of having them on-site and in lockers would be good.

Q: How would you record the games?

A: Phones. Corner of courts.

Q: Have you checked with Alex in athletics for tripods?

A: No.

Discussion:

POINT: There are a lot of tripods on campus. They just have to ask.

MOTION to amend out the tripods.

FOR: Many different sources of tripods on campus, like the Sports Information Department and Academic Technology Center.

MOTION passed by unanimous consent.

AGAINST: They have asked for this in the past.

FOR: Fits the purpose of the club.

FOR: There is past precedence.

Outcome: Approved in amended amount of \$29.98.

F.25.22 Motorsports Club (\$1923.13)--PASSED

Presentation:

QuickJacks Funding. Motorsports Club is a club for anyone interested in cars, motorcycles, or basically anything with an engine and wheels. Car and Engine Enthusiasts. 5000 TL QuickJacks system. Broken and unsafe for users. Total price is 1923.13. Price is 1810 total. Free shipping. Tax 113.13. Total 1929. Gets a lot of use.
