If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.	<i>namely</i> , if any man is above reproach, the husband of one wife, having children who believe, not accused of dissipation or rebellion.	An elder must be blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient.

[LSB] *namely*, if any man is beyond reproach, the husband of one wife, having faithful children, *who are* not accused of dissipation, or rebellious.
