# **U11 Camogie Report**

The U11s had another great season, running from early February to the present. We had a squad of 30 players and once again fantastic participation throughout.

We started the year with a combined Parish League with the U10s through the months of February and March in Maree Indoor Astro; and we are finishing the year with another Parish League through November with the U12s on the 3G Astro in Oranmore!

In between, we expanded to two training sessions per week this year. With a Wednesday session in the Ball Wall in Oranmore adding to our usual Monday evening slot. This amounted to 40 sessions and lots of practice and exposure for all the girls.

We entered two teams in the County U11 League throughout the months of July & August. While Summer Holidays did make it a challenge to keep both teams going at that time of year, it did ensure all girls got plenty of game time - which was our main objective.

From September onwards, we combined training with Gaby and the U12 team and coaches as the girls took part across three teams in the County U12 League. This again provided valuable experience to the girls.

To mark the successful year, the girls had an end of season day out with Bowling followed by some refreshments. Great fun was had by all!

As always we would like to thank all members of the Club Executive for their support. We'd also like to thank all Parents who encourage the girls and turn up week in week out to training and matches throughout the county. We are once again very proud of the girls and delighted to see each of them improve and most importantly enjoy their Camogie throughout the year. #### U12 Camogie – Report

Training commenced on Monday evenings and had 24 registered on ClubZap with all showing up for training. We have 4 male trainers and 2 female all registered with the club child protection officer.

Great individual progress has been made by all the girls and we were able to get a lot of game time with an under 13 development league, ran in April to May, 6 of our girls joined with the under 13's in Group 2 and the rest of the girls played in a Group 6 league. This gave great time to all to develop at their own level and was vital in the girl's development for the game. League ended well as we got to a Shield final in Group 6 and won it.

As in previous years we integrated with the under 11s, a message was sent out to parents of that group and 11 names came forward to play with the under 12s. Teams we split evenly and we had one team in group 2 and one in group 6.

We trained for most of August and September with the under 11s and this worked well to help with the integration of the both age groups.

Everyone received the same game time and integration of players worked very well. Group 2 won their Shield final and Group 6 won the Cup final, there were great displays of Camoige and team work for this campaign was exceptional.

We are currently in middle of our Parish league on Friday nights in the Astro in Oranmore from 7 to 8 and we have 50 girls between under 11 (29) and under 12 (21) for this.

# **U15 Camogie Report**

U15 Camogie were back training in early January and we joined up with the u14s for the preparation for the u15 Camogie Féile. Some Challenge matches in March went well and we started our Féile campaign in the Prairie on April 1st with a match against Salthill Knocknacarra. This looked to be a tough opening match, but a great performance from our girls saw us win on a scoreline of 2-12 to 2-4 and proved to be the start of a very good week. We defeated Kilconieran with a particularly strong defensive performance the following evening and qualified for the semi-finals. Our third group game against Mountbellew Moylough saw us getting game time for many of the panellists and we were set up for a home semi-final against Mullagh Kiltormer, on what proved to be a very nice occasion in Oranmore with a decent crowd on Friday 5th April.

We started the match very well and maintained a lead throughout, but a late rally from Mullagh Kiltormer left just 1 point in it into injury time. A late free was dropped in but we withstood the pressure to qualify for the Féile Final. An Orange weather warning postponed the final by 6 days but a big Oranmore Maree crowd travelled to Duggan Park on Friday 12th April for the Final v Ardrahan.

We competed well in the first half, highlighted by a super 2pt score direct from a sideline from Roisin Coleman, but went in behind at half time. A strong start to the 2nd half had us 4pts ahead with 8 minutes left, but Ardrahan finished stronger, with 2 goals late on to win the cup by a margin of 2pts. Overall, the Féile was a great experience and great team performance by the girls and to come so close to winning it was a huge achievement for our squad, albeit bittersweet that we were not able to bring the trophy back to Oranmore Maree.

The u15 Championship in September was a tough competition for our girls. We started out with a defeat in Ardrahan and following a win against Tuam, we had a crucial game in Salthill against Salthill Knocknacarra. We suffered defeat there to leave us in the Shield Quarter Final. We put in a strong second half against Mountbellew/Moylough to get through that fixture but a defeat to our neighbours Castlegar in the Shield Semi Final ended our season somewhat disappointingly.

Overall, we can look back on our performance in the Féile Final as a highlight of the girls camogie careers and a great week for our squad, and we look forward to the u16 championship in early 2025.

We re-grouped for our Shield final v Mullagh Kiltormer a few days later and narrowly lost out to a last minute goal that clinched victory for the opposition.

Some of the girls then joined the Minor panel for the remainder of the year and the younger girls had their U14/U15 championships to look forward too.

# **Minor Camogie Report**

### **Minor League**

We entered the minor league this year and it provided much needed games for our younger players as the U16 championship was over in April.

We had group games against St. Colman's, and Skehana Menlo. (Salthill were unable to field a team). We qualified for a semi-final v Mountbellew Moylough and the 15 girls available produced a great display to come out on top. We played Skehana Melough in the League final in Duggan Park, mid-June and after a storming 2nd half display we came out on top and claimed the League title.

Due to the timing of this league a number of the older girls were unavailable to to exam commitments, but it was great to get 4 games for this group of girls in May/June.

#### Minor B Championship

We competed in the Minor B Championship and the 3 group games were played in August. We lost our 1st game to Turloughmore, but won our remaining 2 group games against Ardrahan & Mountbellew Moylough.

The minor championship took a break then until November and we played Skehana Menlough in a Quarter-Final on Nov 3rd in Oranmore and we had a convincing victory.

Our semi-final was played in Kilconieron on November 10th and unfortunately we came up against a strong Kilconieron side who fully deserved their victory on the day.

Over 20 of this year's minor panel are still eligible to play minor next year. Thanks to Richie Burke for all the help and guidance this season

# **Junior Camogie**

The Juniors trained with the Senior panel this season. The junior team was made up of U16s, minors and adult players. They have four championship fixtures, in their opening game the won against Kilconieron, in round two they had a walkover from Liam Mellows and in round 3 they had a tough battle away to Ballinasloe where they came shared the points. In the quarter final the girls came up against a very strong Castlebar Mitchels and despite the girls best efforts they just came up short. Over the 3 games the girls played the team showed great spirt and determination. The Junior competition was a great experience for the girls involved. (Gaby Corless)

#### **SENIOR CAMOGIE REPORT 2024 – BARRY LEENANE**

Our Junior/Senior group kicked off training on February 20th in the ballwall in Oranmore. We had 41 girls for both panels and they would train 2 to 3 times per week all year culminating in over 70 sessions up to mid-October. As always, we had a good mix of experience and youth in the group. This is extremely important on both fronts. To keep the experienced girls playing is just as vital as welcoming in new girls to the group. Naturally the younger girls look up to the club stars and learn so much from them and we are very lucky as a club to have such talent amongst us.

#### **LEAGUE**

Our league kicked off on March 17th and we had games most weekends over the next 6 weeks. We played Ardrahan, Castlegar, Kinvara, Athenry, Craughwell and got a bye over Mullagh. Even with low numbers available for the games we remained competitive throughout the campaign. We played a lot of our younger players, many who made their debut in Senior and this gave them valuable experience at adult level. We had a tough away game in Tipperary at the end of June where we played Shannon Rovers who played in the 2023 Munster Intermediate Final. Games against completely different opponents is excellent for experience. Shannon Rovers put on food for us after the game and it turned out to be a great bonding trip for the girls.

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP**

In July we welcomed back Daragh Conneely as coach, along with Gearoid Hanniffy and Pete Carr. Daragh is well known to the group from previous years and it was great to have him involved again. He is one of the finest young coaches in Galway and his knowledge of Galway camogie is unbelievable. Likewise, it was brilliant to have Gearoid and Pete come on board as they both brought a huge amount of experience and a breath of fresh air to the group. Hopefully, they will both remain involved in camogie in the future as we need to hold on to our best coaches where possible. We had 4 group games against Davitts, Sarsfields, Athenry and Ardrahan and ended up placing second in the group. This put us into a quarter final against Mullagh which we ended up playing in Clann na nGaels pitch in Athlone as there were no pitches available in Galway. We won this game by 5 pts. Without really playing well all year we were back in a semi-final against St. Thomas'. They won Senior B in 2023 and unfortunately they outplayed us all over the pitch and ended up beating us by 5 pts. I feel this year was a huge opportunity lost. When we began this year, we had a few experienced girls who left the panel due to travel, study and work. That said, I believe that with the new girls coming into the group and other panel members stepping up this season, this was a missed opportunity to progress. I know most teams in the county would love to be in our position but I feel falling at semi-final stage was a huge disappointment. On the plus side, it's a testament to where our club in presently where losing a semi-final feels like a failure! We all have to acknowledge where we are and where we ultimately want to be. We didn't deserve to get to a final this year as we never really got going as a team. We had a bit of luck with the draw, knowing that a quarter final was a realistic target and another final appearance was within our reach. We suffered injury after injury throughout the year and this is by no means an excuse. It offered girls who may not have featured the chance to play at Senior championship level. Over the 3 years we have been involved with Seniors, we have introduced 26 new girls to the adult training group and at least 13 players made their debut at this level. It's vital that this continues over the coming years as on the flip side we've lost players through work and travel etc. Our Junior team must remain as the pathway to our Senior panel. Gone are the days where you leave Minor and automatically make a Senior squad. Our Junior team affords girls the opportunity to gain vital experience at adult level camogie and gives them the necessary game time to hopefully make a Senior panel. As we all know the support of the executive committee is hugely important for management to do their job successfully.

During my term as manager, I've been lucky to have had their full backing. I'd like to thank Fiona and Gaby for all their help this year

and to all committee members over the last few years. A massive amount of time goes into managing a Senior team and without their help I would not have been able to give so much to the job. I've been involved with various teams over the last 13 years and this was made possible because of the support of my better half, Joanne! She has been a female officer with teams all the way up along but more than that, she has been the most consistently dedicated trainer for years now, Tuesdays and Thursdays every week for 10 months of the year. Her role is far wider than a female officer, she was a mother, a nurse, a friend, an agony aunt and confident where needed and I know the girls will miss her presence greatly. It has been a huge privilege to manage this team and all I can do is wish them well in the future and hope that whoever goes in as the next manager can help them make that last step to a county final win.
