Getting to the Event



- The event will be held in the LSA Multipurpose Room, which is located in the LSA building. The LSA Building is located at 500 S. State St on Central Campus next to the Kelsey Museum of Archaeology. The building is located across the street from Angell/Tisch Hall and the International Center.
- Bus routes 62 and 6 have stops along the S. State that stop at the Union close to the LSA Building. For more information about bus routes, visit theride.org.

- If you are driving, there is a visitor parking lot at 400 Thompson St, near the Student Activities Building. Street metered parking is available along S. State, E. Williams Ave, and some other roads around the Trotter Multicultural Center.

Building and Space Description

- Description of space
 - The event will be held at LSA Multipurpose Room (LSA 1040). The Multipurpose Room is located on the first floor.
- Physical Accessibility
 - The LSA Building is accessible by both stairs and a ramp. Ramps are located at the East entrance (from State St.) and the Northwest entrance (from Maynard). Power doors are located at the Northwest entrance.
 - Once inside the building, the room can be accessed by both stairs and a ramp. Below, a floor plan of the first floor is available.
- Restrooms
 - There is a mens and womens restroom on every floor of the building and every restroom within the building is wheelchair accessible.
 - The first floor has an accessible and gender inclusive restroom across from the Transfer Student Center in Room 1183T.
