# Kaguya's family

### **Kaguya**

Kaguya Shinomiya (四宮 かぐや) is obviously a reference to the Princess from the Tale of the Bamboo Cutter:


Nayotake no Kaguya-hime (なよ竹の輝夜姫) (confirmed by the fanbook)

# **Nayotake**

Her mother's name, **Nayotake** (名夜**竹**), is a reference to the "Nayotake" in Kaguya-hime's full title. The original means "supple bamboo" and refers to the bamboo stalk in which the infant Kaguya was found.



### The Five Suitors and the Impossible Challenges

In the Tale of the Bamboo Cutter, Kaguya-hime got approached by five suitors. Each of them received an **Impossible Challenge** (難題) from her.

The **Five Suitors** were:

Ishidzukuri no Miko (石作 皇子), who was told to get the Stone Begging Bowl of the Buddha (仏の御石の鉢)

Kuramochi no Miko (車持 皇子), who was told to get a Jeweled Branch from Hourai (蓬莱の玉の枝)

**Abe no Miushi** (阿倍 御主人), who was told to get the **Robe of the Fire-Rat** (火鼠の裘)

Ootomo no Miyuki (大伴 御行), who was told to get a **Jewel from a Dragon's** Neck (龍の首の珠)

Isonokami no Maro (石上 麻呂), who was told to get a Cowry Shell Born from a Swallow (燕の産んだ子安貝)

The Princes Kuramochi and Ishidzukuri are based on the real life models **Fujiwara no Fuhito** (藤原 不比等) and **Tajihi no Shima** (多治比 嶋), while **Isonokami**, **Ootomo** and **Abe** are already historical figures.

These people all served in the Daijoukan, the Great Council of State in Japan's Imperial Government, towards the end of the Asuka period.

## <u>Miyuki</u>

Shirogane Miyuki (白銀 御行) is straightforward, he's Ootomo. (confirmed by the fanbook)

Shirogane apparently winning Kaguya's affection/trust by jumping into a deep lake to save her ribbon might be symbolism to show that he surpassed the suitor he's based on. Since unlike Ootomo, who failed his challenge due to seasickness, Shirogane managed to surpass his inability to swim somehow for Kaguya's sake.

### The Pearl from the Dragon's Neck (and The Tiger)

The **Astronomy Club President** is the daughter of the boss of the **Ryuujugumi** (龍珠組) -Clan, which literally means "**Dragon Pearl** Group".

Under that assumption, the Astronomy Club President is probably **Saitou Ryuu** (斉藤龍), the Number 9 student whose first name literally means **Dragon**.

Her actual name is Ryuuju Momo (龍珠 桃)



Her first name Momo (桃) could refer to the Japanese word for the color pink "Momoiro" (桃色), since the Dragon Jewel in the Tale was known to have five colors it could mean that we'll be introduced to a total of five Ryuju's, each named after a different color.


Alternatively, the five colors could be represented through other objects in the series, which seem to represent the Jewel from the Dragon's Neck: The giant papier mache "jewel" Shirogane used during the cultural festival and the ball from kendama Shirogane gave to Kaguya as a Christmas present. Other potential candidates are the necklace Shirogane gave to Kaguya as a birthday present and the ruby on the ring Kaguya used during the Light Novel story.

The **Kendo Club President** who quarrels with the Astronomy Club President might be the Number 5 student in the school ranking, **Arakawa Taiga** (荒川 たい), since the **Tiger** is the Dragon's rival.

The importance of these two names gains further credibility through their cameo in the very first Young Jump Chapter (though "Arakawa" was written as 新川 instead), where they are placed right next to each other.

#### **Isonokami**

**Ishigami Yuu** (石上 優) has literally the same name as **Isonokami**, just with a different reading. *(confirmed by Chapter 104 Title)* 





**Ootomo Kyouko** (大友 京子) and **Ogino Kou** (荻野 コウ) might be a reference to **Prince Ootomo** (大友 皇子)**/Emperor Koubun** (弘文天皇), who the historical Isonokami served until he was usurped.

(Note that while one of the suitor's is also named Ootomo, Ootomo Kyouko/Prince Ootomo is written with completely different kanji)

In the extra to Chapter 156, it is heavily implied that Ishigami almost falling to his death on the stairs is a parallel to Isonokami falling and dying after trying to pick up what he believed to be the Cowry Shell.

### The Cowry Shell Born from a Swallow

Cowry is **Koyasu** and Swallow is **Tsubame** in Japanese, which connects to **Koyasu Tsubame** (子安つばめ). *(confirmed by Chapter 104 Title)*


### **Kuramochi**

Fujiwara Chika (藤原 千花) is probably a reference Fujiwara no Fuhito. (confirmed by the fanbook)

Her design may also have taken some inspiration from **Fujiwara no Mokou** (藤原 妹紅) from the **Touhou** series. (Mokou is possibly supposed to be the daughter of Fujiwara no Fuhito in the Touhou lore and becomes Kaguya (Houraisan)'s rival.)

#### Miko and the Stone Bowl of the Buddha

By process of elimination, **lino Miko** (伊井野  $\lesssim 2$ ) is the second Miko among the suitors, **Ishidzukuri**. *(confirmed by the fanbook)*.

Iino's poem hobby is also most certainly a reference to Ishidzukuri trying to woo Kaguya-hime by persistently writing her poems even after failing his challenge (though writing poems to Kaguya-hime was something all of the suitors did, as it was typical for the time period). Another thing that points to Miko being Ishidzukuri is her friend, **Oosaragi Kobachi** (大仏 こばち). Her last name literally means "Great **Buddha**". A possible way to write her first name "Kobachi", in Kanji, would be 小鉢, which means "Small **Bowl**".





#### Chapter 85

Considering how **Onodera Rei** (小野寺 麗) seems to have taken up a role similar to Osaragi as Iino's friend and advisor, the "dera" (寺) in her name might be a reference to the "Buddhist temple" Ishidzukuri should have taken the Stone Bowl from.

In fact, "nodera" (野寺) can be translated as "random temple", which might be a reference to Ishidzukuri trying to trick Kaguya-hime with a regular Stone Bowl he picked up from a temple in Japan.






Chapter 82

Considering current events in the series, it is not unlikely that there'll be a fallout between Iino and Osaragi to parallel Ishidzukuri throwing away his bowl after Kaguya-hime finds out that he lied about it being from India.


#### Abe and the Robe of the Fire Rat

The sixth member is probably going to be a reference to the remaining suitor, **Abe**. There are in fact two such characters, the Rank 4s of the Second and First Year Students at Shuuchiin, **Abe Wawon** (阿部 和音) and **Abe Yayuyo** (阿部 夜由代) Rank 49 among the first years, **Shiranui Koromo** (不知火 ころも), seems to be a reference to the **Robe of the Fire Rat**: "Shiranui" is a "**Will-o'-Wisp"**, a **Fire Youkai**, and "Koromo" is Japanese for **Clothing**.



Fujiwara's Impossible Challenge is to be a new character **Hourai-chan** related to Fujiwara not playing piano anymore.

Since **Hourai** refers to a fictional foreign country, Fujiwara's Impossible Challenge may be related to the foreign **Saha** (サハ) **Club President**, the **Second Prince of Galdan Alrasam**. The "Saha" here might refer to **સाखा** (サハ) , the Nepali word for **Branch** (or perhaps some other Indian language).

Fujiwara/Kuramochi was also the **second prince** to approach Kaguya-hime. Their clubs (Saha and TG) seem to have raced against each other in the relay and he looks to have a role similar to Fujiwara, a mediator between the Astronomy and Kendo Club President, like Fujiwara was between Shirogane and Kaguya.

Alternatively the branch may be represented by some of Fujiwara's family members and/or TG club friends (see "The Fujiwara Family" Section)

### **The Fujiwara Family**

All the names of the Fujiwara family members seem to be connected to plant life:

Chika (千花) means Thousand Flowers.

Her younger sister, **Moeha** (萌葉), has the Kanji for **budding** (萌え) and **leaf** (葉). Her older sister, **Toyomi** (豊実), has the Kanji for **plentiful** (豊か) and **fruit** (実). Her father's name, **Daichi** (大地), means **land**.

Her mother's name, **Maho** (万穂), means **Ten Thousand Ears** ("ear" refers here to the tip part of a cereal plant).

The relation to plants may be a reference to the Jeweled Branch from Hourai. Particularly her sisters, since in some versions the branch is described to have **pearls for fruits** and **silver for leaves**.

## The Emperor

After all the princes failed their tasks, the Emperor of Japan, **Mikado** (帝), asked Kaguya to marry him and was rejected without being given a trial. Towards the end of the tale he tried to protect Kaguya from being taken back to the moon.

That is also the name of **Shijo Mikado** (四条 帝), the Number One student who ranked above even Shirogane in the mock exam and is probably Maki's brother. *(confirmed in Chapter 161 and 211)*

# The Illustration from the "Tale of Genji"

In Chapter 17 of the **Tale of Genji** appears a fictional painting of the Tale of the Bamboo Cutter, made by the painter **Kose no Oumi** (巨勢 相覧) with a caption by the poet **Ki no Tsurayuki** (紀 貫之).

The two members of the Mass Media Club, **Kose Erika** (巨瀬 エリカ) and **Kino Karen** (紀 かれん) share those names.

### **Others**

According to Chapter 166, Osaragi, Shiranui, Ryuju and Tsubame are known as the "**Impossible** Girls" (難題女子, lit. "**Challenge** Girls",), which ties in with each of them being named after one of the Impossible Challenges.

In the fanbook it was confirmed that **Hayasaka Ai (**早坂 愛**)** represents the emissary from the Moon who took Kaguya-hime back.

The one who tied for seventh place with Kashiwagi on the Second Year Ranking in Chapter 31 is called **Sumitomo Koichi (**住友 光一**)**. **Sumitomo (**住友**)** was also one of the real life **Big Four Zaibatsu**, which the Shinomiya family is a part of in this story.

In the volume extra to Chapter 180 it was revealed that Hayasaka's two gyaru friends are named **Hinoguchi** (火ノ口) and **Suruga** (駿河).

Hinoguchi could be seen as a long form of the Japanese word for "volcanic crater" ( $\mbox{\ensuremath{\mathcal{K}}}\mbox{\ensuremath{\square}}$ ), while Suruga is the name of a Japanese province. Put together, these two names could point towards the famous volcano in Suruga, **Mt. Fuji**. It is widely believed that this is where the Emperor burnt the elixir of immortality in the Tale of the Bamboo Cutter.
