Student studio is intended for students (10-18) who are looking for private lessons to expand their artistic abilities. The curriculum follows SC state standards. The instructor works directly with students and their parents to ensure a class that accommodates students at introductory, intermediate, and advanced levels. Students may begin the course at the beginning of any given month or leave at the end of any given month.

Objective, Purpose, and Course Goals

The objective of BCA's studio classes is to provide a private, individualized curriculum for students to learn new techniques, skills, and craft. This 5 month curriculum finds the student where they are to either introduce them to a technique, provide practice in the technique, or work towards mastery of the skill.

Student Learning Outcomes

Communication

- Understand and use the terminology of drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, and design *Formal Exploration*
 - Apply the formal / visual elements of art. Including but not limited to : Line/Marks/Shape/Space/Value/Texture/and Color

Visual Problem Solving

- Resolve projects through technique, design, craft and creativity

Exploration of Tools and Media

- Demonstrate skill in craft including: studio practices, care for materials, and mediums

Investigation of History

- Basic understanding of the origins of art styles and different forms of art *Course Evaluation Objectives*
 - Understanding of techniques
 - Advancement of visual solutions
 - Mastery of craftsmanship

Materials & Supplies

For the first course, students will be provided with a box of materials (provided by the supply fee) necessary to complete that month's project. Every month, the materials for the box will be changed in order to accommodate the new project.

Assignments / Homework

<u>Studio Projects:</u> This course is designed for students to complete 1 studio project a month. While every month is different, students are able to join in at the beginning of any month. Studio projects typically have 2 lessons and 2 studio days. Some projects are larger and are accomplished over 5-8 classes. These projects include a rubric to illustrate the expectations of that month's project.

<u>Sketchbook Assignments:</u> at the beginning of the course, students will be provided with a sketchbook as part of their supply fee. Sketchbooks will be checked every class. Students may choose to take their studio project home instead of their sketchbook.

Optional Grades / Critique

Students will be given a rubric for each project before they begin it. The rubric will detail the expectations as well as guidelines for the project. Should parents choose, a grade can be given for each project alongside constructive feedback. Sketchbooks will be marked for completion. Should parents not desire a grade for their students, one does not have to be given. Evaluation in this course is at complete discretion of the parents.

Course Policies

Students are highly encouraged to attend every class for the month they pay for to ensure proper completion of the project. If a student is registered for a class and does not attend the first class, they will be automatically dropped from that month's project (unless alternative arrangements are made with the instructor). Students may not schedule extra time in the studio than what is provided. Students are expected to follow the directions given (either behavioral or instructional directions). Should students not follow directions or attempt projects, BCA reserves the right to stop instruction for the student.

Project Schedule for the Curriculum

Artwork 1: Glass Fusion

For this artwork, students will design a glass-fuse artwork that transforms geometric shapes into fluid, organic compositions. The finished pieces embody a deeper, personal interpretation of one aspect of the students lives.

Artwork 2: Distorted Self-Portraits

For this project, students will dive into the world of charcoal and self-portraiture. Students will utilize an app on a device to take a photograph of themselves distorted. They will then use charcoal to draw their portraits.

Artwork 3: Disposable Photography

For this artwork, students will receive a disposable camera. We will learn about the history of photography and techniques to capture images. Students will be provided with a prompt and develop a series of photographs for it.

Artwork 4: Ceramic Studio

For this artwork, students will be given artistic freedom. Students will be required to utilize coil and handbuilding techniques to develop their artwork
