Texture Overlay

5 Photos uploaded to Flickr Your choice of textures and other photos to use

- 1. In Lightroom, find two photos you want to open together in Photoshop
- 2. Select both by clicking on the first one, holding down Command, and clicking on the second one. (You can let go of Command now)
- 3. When they're both selected, right-click on either one and pick:

Edit In... > Open As Layers in Photoshop

- 4. Once you're in Photoshop and both photos are loaded, find the Layers window on the right hand side. Make sure the **Texture layer is "above"** the other layer by clicking on the texture layer and drag it underneath the other layer.
- 5. Now we'll change the blending option from **Normal** to **Overlay**. (You can also see how **Soft Light** or any of the others look). You find the blending option in the layers window. It's a drop-down menu that defaults to "Normal."
- 6. Ta-da! If the effect is too much, you can lower the **Opacity** from 100% to anything you want. The opacity slider is right next to the blending mode drop-down menu.
- 7. **If the texture doesn't line up with your photo** there are different ways to rotate it or stretch it to fit.

One is the **Move tool**. This is at the top of the tool bar. You can also hit the (v) key. Make sure **Show transform controls** is checked (you only see it when the move tool is activated). Now just click and drag one of the corners to resize.

One way to rotate the layer is **Edit** > **Transform** > **Rotate 90 (CC or CCW)**

When you're all done..... to save back to Lightroom, just go to File > Save

If you want to save it to a specific location (like the desktop)

- 1. File > Save As...
- 2. Switch the format to JPEG
- 3. Name it whatever you want
- 4. Double check the destination and click Save
- 5. When it asks you the quality on the next screen, you can enter 8.
