



## Why is San Diego better than Phoenix?

#### 1. Weather!!!

- a. San Diego's average temperature from June-September is 28° F cooler
- b. Petco Park has ONLY endured 3 rain delays since 2004 when it opened here in San Diego, with the last one being in 2017.
- c. Phoenix temperatures can reach up to 120° F
- d. Phoenix temperature highs (last 4 years) August, 2019 115°F | July, 2018 116°F | June, 2017 119°F | June, 2016 118°F
- e. Playing in 100°F+ while seems like a viable option to play in AZ, can cause serious health hazards among players

#### 2. Proximity

- a. The longest drive for the proposed San Diego plan is 50 minutes from Southwestern College to Palomar College.
- b. Phoenix sports the longer drive between Surprise and Mesa which takes 53 minutes
- c. 6 of the San Diego fields are within a 25 minute driving range, and 4 of the central locations including Petco Park are within 15 minutes!

#### 3. Covid-19

- a. The coronavirus cases and deaths are very comparable here in San Diego county to Maricopa County (see above)
  - i. The big difference is while Arizona is just getting started with restrictions and an uptick in cases, San Diego is easing stay-at-home restrictions.
  - ii. California was the first state to impose a statewide stay-at-home order and has been extremely adamant about the safety and well-being of the people.

## Why is San Diego safer than teams staying in their hometown and traveling?

- 1. Reduced travel
  - a. The growing concern for the players safety during travel has merit.
    - i. Traveling in airplanes and airports would expose the players, coaches, and support staff to some of the hotbeds for the virus.
    - ii. Staying in new hotels from city to city poses health hazards, as there is no way to know who has been staying in them as well as the health and safety standards the hotels use.

## 2. Hotspots

- a. Teams home fields are located in areas such as Los Angeles, New York, Boston, and Chicago. These areas have been hit especially hard and should not be hosting sporting events.
- b. Covid cases in these 'hometowns'
  - 1. Statistics current of May 7th, 6PM ET
  - ii. Los Angeles (LA County) cases: 2,930 per 1 million
  - iii. New York (State #'s due to NYM, NYY) Covid cases: 17,199 per 1 million
  - iv. Boston (Suffolk County) cases: 9,801 per 1 million
  - v. Chicago (Cook County) cases: 7,508 per 1 million
  - vi. \*Reminder\* San Diego (SD County) cases: 1,294 per 1 million
- c. Traveling to and from these hotspots poses great potential to further spread this nasty virus.

#### **Medical Personal:**

- 1. Teams already have medical staff that would travel with them.
- 2. 5 of the 9 facilities listed have medical rooms while the others would need an modern style approach by using medical pop up tents, (link provided to show concept)
- 3. San Diego boasts world class hospital systems. One of the sites (UCSD) has a top-notch hospital just beyond the outfield.

#### **Return to normalcy:**

- 1. We all want to get MLB teams back in their parks. While not feasible for the foreseeable future, it is important to have that in mind when scheduling.
- 2. Given the unknown nature of this virus, we very well could see a time later during this season where we could have teams return to their home parks.
- 3. Schedules should account for this, having interleague/divisional games early in the season where travel distances would be longer. Leaving divisional matchups and interleague play for the latter half of the season would be instrumental in a plan to get teams back in their parks.
