 - No requirement based on percentage to inventory vs. professional learning (currently 73% vs 27%)
 - H3 Focus (high skill, wage, demand) as a consideration in spending
 - Communications and STS highest spending areas
 - Balancing H3 with student interest areas
 - NFS certified for food equipment, industry standard equipment across all areas
 - Question: Can we use Perkins funds in conjunction with State CTE funds? (Krystl, WW)
 - FROM NDE: splitting the cost of an item between the 2 grants is allowable and for tracking purposes, the split in funding would show on the district's transaction reports.
