Instructions: By the end of every month I will collect at least 2 Cornell notes per week. Each Cornell doc per week is worth 20 points. Each month this is a whopping 120 PTs

To complete cornell notes do the following;

Step 1: Click File and Make a Copy for this document. Now you have a copy of your own Cornell Notes template. Keep this so you can make additional copies

Step 2: Go to the most recent "study guide" on APEX. Your goal (distance or in-person) is to take at least one full page of notes for each study guide. Write your main notes in the "notes" column. Write all of the highlighted terms and definitions from your study guide in the column labeled questions and terms. Finally once you have written your questions, terms, and main notes I would like you to write a 3-4 sentence summary of what your notes are about, reflect on the lesson you just read (this is a moment to summarize your information and reflect on what you learned).

Step 3: Repeat the process each week. Save these in a separate file on google docs OR use one google doc and save on there.
