Current Events Analysis World History

Students will demonstrate that they are able to find an adequate article about an international event and explain thoroughly what it was about and how it affects the world around us.

Criteria for Current Events Assessment

- 1. Select an article pertaining to something that is going on around the world within 20 days to the day you write your summary.
 - a. The article must be of international importance.
 - b. Articles must be <u>written</u> by a reputable news source and have a <u>detailed analysis</u> of the topic it is covering. *In other words, do not select a news video or a story that has three short paragraphs to complete this assessment.*
- 2. You must write a summary and connection to the article that is at least one page in length.
 - a. The first part of your analysis is a summation of the article.
 - i. What is the article about?
 - ii. What sources did the author use to write the article?
 - b. The rest of the analysis will focus on the connection and significance of the article.
 - i. How does this article impact you as a person?
 - ii. How does this article impact the world around us?
 - iii. Make a connection to something that happened in the past
