Recently I got an email from John Rader, city spokesman asking the Mojave River Valley Museum's help on Barstow's timeline.

If you go to the City Council's Chamber you can see the timeline as it stands. What the city was looking for was a few more specific dates and to see if they are missing anything. They are also looking for nominations for events to be included especially from the last five years.

As I was first looking into this project I realized that this really shouldn't just be the city and the museum's project. It is our timeline and I feel everyone should have the chance for their two cents worth. The following is the timeline with my input, additions, subtractions and a couple of personal favorite historical events. 1880s

Waterman Junction Post Office changed there name to Barstow Post Office effectively naming the new town after William Barstow Strong, President of the Santa Fe Railroad, January 15, 1886

1910s

Modern Harvey House opened, 1911

Barstow High School first established in a home near corner of First and Williams Streets, September 15, 1915

First Barstow Branch Library started as part of the Barstow High School, 1916 Hillside Apartments, on the end of Cottage Street first unit built 1917. Longest continuing running business in Barstow

1920s

Grand opening "of our newly rebuilt city" after business district was moved from in front of the Harvey House in between the railroad tracks to where Old Town Barstow is today, July 4, 1925

Route 66 Established, 1926

Barstow International Airport opened, one of the first national airports. The site near Lenwood Road and National Trails Highway was chosen by Charles Lindburgh for TAT (later TWA) airline, October 1, 1929

1930s

First Street Bridge opened, April 26, 1930

Beacon Tavern (hotel) opened in 1930 delayed due to the stock market crash of

Southwest Gas Established, 1931

First Mardi Gras Parade, October 31, 1932

Modern Barstow High School Opened, September 1938

1940s

Mojave Anti Aircraft Range (later Camp Irwin) established, 1940

Harry Partch, avant garde composer and hobo, hitchhiked through Barstow and is inspired to write his seminal work, *Barstow-Eight Hitchhiker Inscriptions*, February 1940

Marine Corps Logistics Base Established, December 28, 1942

Lee Berry Founded Slash X Ranch, 1942

Victory Homes Established, 1943

Brunner's Tiny Time Shop "The Worlds Smallest Store" opened, 1946

Barstow High School's Award winning and Rose Bowl attending Marching Band Started, 1947

City of Barstow incorporated, 1947

Griego's Market, later became Rosita's Restaurant, began 1948

Barstow Park & Recreation District Formed

1950s

Idle Spurs Restaurant Opened, 1955

Printer Review Became Desert Dispatch 1958

Franchise to Southern California Water

Barstow Community Hospital opened at New Location (left Williams Street)— June 9, 1957 only to close on July 25 due to lack of funds it will open for good on January 15, 1958

Pioneer Antenna at Goldstone is put into service, October 1958
