SB 29

Business Advisory Council--IRC Coursework

 Kelly Kozar shared the Power Point above. A lengthy discussion was held about ways to incorporate industry recognized credential points into already existing courses. This will be a standing agenda item moving forward.

World Languages at LMS

Should 8th grade students be required to take a foreign language? If not, what
other opportunities are there for instruction (i.e. not an additional study hall)?
 The consensus was that we don't necessarily need to require it but we must
have some other options in place before making this change. Simply giving kids
another study hall as an option is not an acceptable alternative.

• Algebra I/Foreign Language Credit at LMS

Why is a higher percentage required for high school credit at Learwood vs.
 ALHS? The issue is not the credit, it's the foundation they need to be successful in higher level courses. That's why there is a higher standard. The high school requires more than a passing grade to move onto an honors track. Both Math and World Languages felt it was important to keep this standard.

Summer Coursework Assignments

Discussion about how students know and find out about summer requirements.
 What about students who register during the summer? Are they being
 exempted? This will be handled administratively by the building principals as
 the committee did not feel students who move last minute should be penalized
 for not completing summer coursework, but also need to be able to get the skills
 needed to be successful in the course.
