New Parkview teachers attended PAX training on Oct. 11, 2021. **Curriculum & Instruction Update** Our K-2 teachers are in the midst of **LETRS training**. LETRS training is structuring literacy training that will help them with their English language arts instruction. They will continue engaging in over the course of the school year. MC squared (math) training is continuing throughout the school year, both on Teacher Training days and through MC squared trainer, Megan Kidwell, who comes to our school to coach teachers on math instruction and meet with them during their PLCs. On November 12th, on our Teacher Training Day, our teachers will engage in intense MC squared training, as well. We are excited about this training as it incorporates hands-on learning to help students understand math on a deeper level. With our early testing results we are seeing a tremendous need for math interventions, so we know that this will help a great Our teachers are using the **eSpark program**, an online intervention program, which is very useful in determining their students' knowledge and providing activities that will help them gain mastery in their academic standards in both ELA and Math. Our K-2nd grade classes continue testing in **I-Station** on a monthly basis. This testing helps our teachers determine individual students' "standards of concern" so that the teacher can best plan interventions to bring them up to (and work to exceed) grade level standards. Grades 3-5 have tested in the (Interim Measure of Student Success and Achievement), a new assessment required by the NMPED three times per year- The beginning, middle and end of the school year. Unfortunately, we have found that the reports provided after this test do not indicate specific areas of concern, so we are planning to have our grade 3-5 teacher give their students the **I-Station** test, as well. We are doing this so that we can determine the students' "standards of concern" and target them in instruction. On Wednesday, November 3rd, we will be having our November **Upcoming Events** All-Staff Meeting from 3:15-4pm and we will be having our November Leadership Meeting on Nov. 10, 2021, from 3:15-4pm. We look forward to having our fourth PAC (Parent Advisory **Committee)** meeting on Nov. 10, 2021, from 5:15-6:15 pm. On Thursday, October 14th, (from 5-6:30 pm) we will be having a

Family Math Game Night at Parkview! Parents are invited to

come to the school and take part in math games with their children.

- Fall Picture retakes through MJ Thomas will take place from 8am-12pm on Monday, October 25th.
- Red Ribbon Week will be from October 25-28. Our themes each day will be: "Drug-Free Looks Like Me!" "PV Spirit Day! "Little Warriors make healthy choices!" "Being HEALTHY will brighten your day!" Mystery staff members will be randomly giving prizes for students who are proudly wearing their red ribbons and who are demonstrating PAX Leadership all week. Camelia Herrera, our school counselor is spearheading this project at Parkview!
- On November 10th, progress reports will be issued.
- On November 11th, we will be having a **Veterans Day Celebration** where we invite our local Veterans to our campus. It begins at 9 am with an assembly. Our Assistant Principal and his father and son will be performing "The Armed Forces Medley" recognizing each branch of the military service. Our Pre-K-2nd grade will be performing "You're a Grand Old Flag," and our 3rd-5th graders will be performing "America the Beautiful." Our students will both sing and sign these patriotic songs. Each grade level will share a "Thank You Note" with our veterans and then we will invite our veterans to a Veterans Day Breakfast in our building. Each grade level and the Parent Advisory Committee will take responsibility for the set-up, food and decor at the breakfast. Prior to Veterans Day, our students will be learning about veterans and our teachers will be decorating their hallway bulletin boards to honor our veterans.
- On November 11, in the evening, our **Pre-K** plans to have their "**Stone Soup Night**" at Parkview.
- On November 12, 2021, on our Teacher Training Day, our teachers will engage in MC squared training.


Parent / Community Involvement
