What to pack...Senior Trip 2025

On the Bus: Dress comfortably. It is a long drive. You can bring a pillow and/or a small blanket if you would like. You might want them on the overnight trip home.

At the Hotel: You will want to bring comfortable clothes for the hotel...we do not spend a lot of time at the hotel but you might want to change into something more comfortable once we get there.
