¿Qué son los verbos modales?

Verbos modales. Los modos (también modales, verbos auxiliares modales, auxiliares modales) son verbos especiales que se comportan de manera irregular en inglés. Son diferentes de los verbos normales como "trabajar, jugar, visitar" Proporcionan información adicional sobre la función del verbo principal que le sigue. Tienen una gran variedad de funciones comunicativas. Ejemplos:

Modal Verb	Expressing	Example
must	Strong obligation	You must stop when the traffic lights turn red.
	logical conclusion / Certainty	He must be very tired. He's been working all day long.
must not	prohibition	You must not smoke in the hospital.
can	ability	I can swim.
	permission	Can I use your phone please?
	possibility	Smoking can cause cancer.
could	ability in the past	When I was younger, I could run fast.
	polite permission	Excuse me, could I just say something?
	possibility	It could rain tomorrow!
may	permission	May I use your phone please?
	possibility, probability	It may rain tomorrow!
Might	polite permission obligation	Might I suggest an idea?
	possibility, probability	I might go on holiday to Australia next year.
need not	lack of necessity/absence of obligation	I need not buy tomatoes. There are plenty of tomatoes in the fridge.
should/ought to	50 % obligation	I should / ought to see a doctor. I have a terrible headache.
	advice	You should / ought to revise your lessons

Modal Verb	Expressing	Example
	logical conclusion	He should / ought to be very tired. He's been working all day long.
had better	advice	You 'd better revise your lessons
