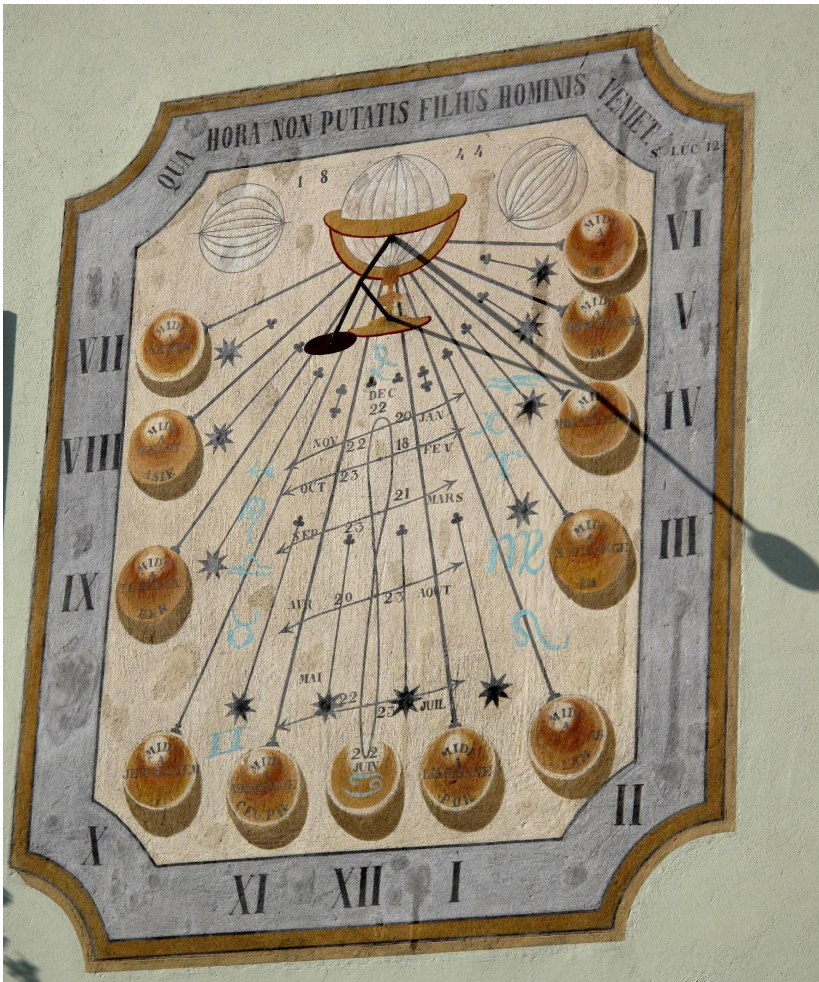

Christ-Centered

We confess the apostolic faith in Jesus Christ according to the Holy Scriptures. We affirm the authority of the Scriptures as the authoritative source and norm, "according to which all doctrines should and must be judged" (Formula of Concord). We accept the ecumenical creeds and the Lutheran Confessions as true witnesses to the Word of God.

Mission-Driven



We believe that the mission of the Church is to preach the Gospel and to make disciples for Christ. We believe that making disciples — in our congregations, in our communities and nations, and around the world — must be a priority of the Church in the present age.

Traditionally-Grounded

We affirm the ecumenical creeds and the faithful witness of the Church across time and space. We endorse the form and practices of the universal Church that are consistent with Scripture, particularly the office of the ministry and the tradition of worship under Word and Sacrament. We seek dialogue and fellowship with other Lutheran churches and with faithful Christians of other confessions.

Congregationally-Focused

We strive to be a church that is organized to facilitate the ministries of local congregations in a posture of servant-hood and a spirit of partnership, through the provision of resources, connections and information.

FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

The color blue, used for the vestments and paraments of Advent, is redolent of the deep blue of twilight just before dawn, symbolic of the Christian hope for the coming of the Light of the World.

FIRST READING: The nation of Judah was defeated in war by the King of Babylon in 587. Jerusalem was razed, the Temple destroyed, and the Davidic line of kings ended. Jeremiah proclaims that this happened because of the sin of Judah. However, here Jeremiah's screed of warning and judgment gives way to the promise of God's salvation. 'A righteous Branch will spring up for David,' meaning that a Davidic king will again rise after the shame and sadness of the Babylonian exile. Christians believe this promise was fulfilled in Jesus: Son of David, Son of God.

SECOND READING: Paul asks God to strengthen the hearts of the Thessalonians, as they look forward to the promised day of redemption. Paul prays that they may be 'blameless' before God the Father. Of course, this does not mean that we will make no mistakes. Rather, it has to do with the attitude of faith, hope, and love which is implanted in us by the power of the



Holy Spirit. The Spirit calls us to daily repentance and faith, so that we may rejoice in God's promises each day that he gives us.

GOSPEL: Jesus speaks about his return to earth in glory. It is the day of God's redemption; the day God 'cashes in' and brings the people whom Jesus has bought with his blood into the everlasting kingdom. In this reading, Jesus both encourages his disciples to look forward to that time, but also to keep alert so that sin, death and the devil, which seem to reign on earth, do not gain the upper hand. Their hearts are not to be 'weighed down,' but instead they are to be alert and pray for strength.

A central theme of Advent is light illuminating the darkness. Both the prelude and communion anthem define the source of this light, Jesus Christ. The Bach prelude, "Christ, You are the Day and Light," is from the "Neumeister Chorales," recently discovered Bach Organ works (1985). Annette's anthem, "God is Light" invites us to follow the light of the Good Shepherd, who gives us peace.

GREAT THANKSGIVING



It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord. When first he came to us in the lowliness of our human body, he accomplished the work you purposed long ago and opened for us the way of eternal salvation; so that when he comes again in majesty and glory we may see at last your work completed and receive the salvation promised us, which we await in confidence and hope. 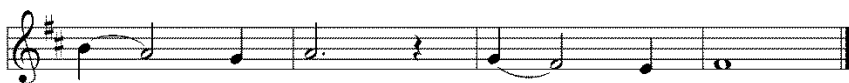

DISTRIBUTION

Admission to the Sacrament of the Altar is by invitation of the Lord, presented through the Church to those who are baptized. They may receive the Lord's Body and Blood who are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, who commune in their home churches, and who believe that Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is truly present in, with, and under the forms of bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

Those who for these or other reasons choose not to receive Holy Communion may come to the table for a pastoral blessing.

You may drink the wine from the common chalice or take an individual glass on your way to the table if you wish to receive the wine from the pouring chalice.
