

Season 15 | Games Pillar Director Position Description

This position is responsible for all league coaching, training, safety, teams management, officiating, adherence to WFTDA rules and sanctioning requirements, scheduling, travel organization, overseeing the Return to Play Committee, and interleague communication in addition to all regular Board of Director responsibilities for League Management. The Games Pillar conducts business through monthly meetings, proactive communication, and ensuring active participation by all pillar members.

Under this pillar serves the following Chairs:

1. Officiating Chair - coordinates and trains skating and non-skating officials, maintains active knowledge of WFTDA game rules, and manages track needs for practices and game days
2. Interleague Chair - responsible for tournament planning, coordinating with outside leagues for games, coordinates with the Events Pillar in league game date development, maintains knowledge of sanctioning requirements, tracks ranking and viable competitors for the travel team, handles contracts between leagues, maintains compliance with WFTDA league and charter team requirements, and supervises and coordinates the following:
 - a. An appointed WFTDA representative who conducts votes on behalf of the league
 - b. The Risk Coordinator who manages safety supplies for the league; organizes medics; act as subject-matter-expert for safety protocol, resources, and advises on pandemic-related guidelines; handles injury related paperwork; and handles safety assessments for the league
 - c. The Scheduling Coordinator who manages interaction between the league and the practice facility, schedules practice dates and times and ensures league calendars are up to date, evaluates practice space invoices to ensure charges are accurate, and organizes league notifications for practice updates
3. Teams and Training Chair - acts as Head Coach for the league, develops league-wide coaching plans with team priorities, goals, and safety in mind, coordinates with Team Captains to meet each team's needs, organizes outside training and development opportunities for the league, maintains practice and game day related supplies and equipment, and oversees and coordinates with:
 - a. Team Coaches
 - b. Team Captains (elected by each team)
 - c. New Skater Program Coordinator who develops and maintains the new skater program, develops coaching and training, organizes and maintains league-wide

assessments and skills testing for safety and skill minimums, and organizes and schedules new skater program coaches
