From October 1, 2018 through November 9, 2018, the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) collaborated with schools in Iowa to conduct the 2018 Iowa Youth Survey (IYS). The 2018 IYS is the seventeenth in a series of surveys that have been completed every two or three years since 1975. The survey is conducted with students in grades 6, 8, and 11 attending Iowa public and private schools. The IYS includes questions about students' behaviors, attitudes, and beliefs, as well as their perceptions of peer, family, school, neighborhood, and community environments.

The 2018 Iowa Youth Survey contains 212 questions and is divided into seven sections (A-G).

Section A. Demographic Characteristics (7 questions)

Section B. Things About Me (66 questions)

Section C. My Beliefs and Attitudes (18 questions)

Section D. Peer Questions (12 questions)

Section E. School Questions (62 questions)


