What to SEE •• and DO

- Wat Phrathat Doi Suthep (temple on the mountain, go up right before sunset to see those views [3])
- Elephant Nature Park 🐘
- Doi Inthanon National Park (highest mountain in Thailand)
- Bua Tong Sticky Waterfall (can climb up the limestone on the waterfall!)
- Maya Mall (if you feel like shopping or going to the movies here, also cool just to see, there's a food court too)
- Sunday Night Walking Street Market (in Old City, starts at Tha Pae Gate down to Ratchadamnoen Road from 4pm-midnight. So much food, so many things to buy)
- Lantern Festival (Loy Krathong/Yi Peng) (go to the bridge on Mae Ping River)
- Wat Phra Singh (temple)
- Wat Chedi Luang (temple)
- Wat Phra That Doi Kham (temple)
- Take a cooking class! (you'll see advertisements for them if you walk around the Old City) (I went to Sammy's Thai Cooking School, he's very sweet and toured us around his local market too)
- Warorot Market ตลาดวโรรส (Kad Luang)(inside/outside market)
- Mueang Mai Market (right near Warorot Market, lots of fresh foods)

- JingJai Market Chiang Mai (more crafty, organic things and foods.
 Best to go on weekend)
- Huay Tung Tao Lake (lounge in little huts on the lake)
- Tour Chiang Mai University (tours are 60 baht)

- Chic Nail 5 (in the old city)

General Things to know 🤓

- For temples:
 - o your knees and shoulders should always be covered, otherwise you won't get let in/will have to wear a long skirt to cover up

- Especially in Bangkok they are stricter at the Grand Palace and will make men put on pants or a skirt if they are wearing shorts
- You're going to have to take your shoes off when you go into temples, so maybe wear slides
- Don't point at things with your toes, it's considered really offensive
- Always have cash on you!
- Don't drink the tap water
- Tipping culture is not really a thing (unless you get a massage or something)
- You can generally only buy alcohol from stores between: 11am 2pm and 5pm to midnight.
- The Thai National Anthem plays at 8AM and 6PM everyday (if you're in a market you should standstill until its over)
 - The royal anthem for the King also plays before every movie in the theatre and you should also stand for it
- It's basically illegal to talk badly about the King so generally don't ask people about him
- Thailand is also under a military coup again, people don't outwardly express their political opinions like we do in the states so be mindful

How to GET AROUND:

- Red truck (Rod Daeng/Songthaew)(usually 30 baht/person, but they will probably rip you off if you're a tourist)
- GRAB app (like Uber, can fit up to 4 people for a fixed price, there are always coupon codes around)

- Go to the Golden Triangle look out point (can also do a boat tour in the river)
- Longneck/Hill tribe peoples tour (can pay a little \$ to go tour their villages and see all the handmade goods they make/see how they live in general)
