Declaration of Interests – Councillors are invited to declare any personal or prejudicial interest, including the nature and extent of such interests they may have in any items to be considered at this meeting. They are also reminded to consider whether in the light of recent activities any items within their Register of Interests should be updated.

- 1. The minutes of the meeting held on the 14th July were agreed and signed.
- 2. Clerk's report i. Parking at Aylestone, the situation has improved, the lines have been painted and the walkway is being adhered to.
- 3. Chairman's report i. Seat in St Giles, Mr James Morrish has kindly agreed to donate a seat to the parish in memory of his father, it will be situated on the grass area on the entrance to Sunnyside, TK Play have been contacted to supply a seat, Cllr Ayre advises that a concrete pad needs to be laid to secure the seat to.
- ii. An email has been received from Wicksteed for the annual inspection this will be ordered.
- 4. Highways i. The Dodscott Wood property TDC Enforcement are aware of the situation, it was reported the property is definitely lived in. Cllr Lock is to make further enquires.

The second property is in a poor state of tidiness with vermin reported Environmental health will be informed, also there has been dumping of rubble in a field near Cranford, this will be investigated.

- ii. School Path, Mr Birch is awaited.
- iii. Cllr Ayre was thanked for all the spraying he has undertaken around the village; it is very much appreciated.
- 5). County and District Councillors items.

Cllr Saywell reported that it has been a quiet month, now being on the Cabinet a lot of decisions have to be made. This is a covid advanced response area with more community testing and greater use of mobile testing vans that can also be used to get a vaccine. Covid numbers are a lot higher than they where mainly in the 15–19-year-old age group, events like Boardmasters have created spikes. Last week there where 17 in North Devon hospital with covid, 23 this week. Infections are likely to continue with the return of children to school. The increase in social workers pay has just been approved this is to help improve the situation following a poor Ofsted report. A devolution bid has been submitted on behalf of the District and County Council if successful some of the emphasised topics would be more affordable housing for local workers, net zero carbon and investment in market towns to name but a few.

Cllr Lock reported that the covid testing van is in Torrington on a Tuesday, the new lateral flows test can be obtained. Cllr Lock reported that Torridge Councillors approved support for North Devon

Biosphere Nature Recovery Plan and Declaration but not Cllr Lock the email has been circulated with the information.

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Cllr Clarke reported on attending a housing crisis meeting, the conclusion was there are no houses being built, Cllr Clarke thinks developers should be contributing more affordable housing. The refugee crisis was reported on how some local people are willing to offer accommodation for a short period. Homelessness and the Armed forces are within Cllr Clarkes remit.
