
Biking Vikings Celebrations!

2023 ARTS SCHOLARSHIP


ONLINE APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE NOW

The Howard County Arts Council is pleased to offer scholarships for students who would like to pursue a degree in the arts. This year, HCAC will award a minimum of \$10,000 in scholarship funds to students entering college in the 2023-2024 academic year. Scholarships must be used for enrollment in an accredited college program for a degree in the arts. Awards will be made in the minimum amount of \$1,000 and may be used for tuition and fees only.

Applications will be reviewed by the Arts Council's Scholarship Panel, which is made up of professionals working in a variety of artistic disciplines. Review criteria will include artistic merit, demonstrated knowledge of an artistic discipline, commitment to a career in the arts, and a demonstrated track record of success in an academic setting. Applicants will be notified of their application status in March 2023.


