NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing and the ISSA Procedural Rules.
- 1.2. Under ISSA PR 18(a), the right of appeal is denied.
- 1.3. The US Sailing prescriptions to rule 63.1 are deleted and will not apply.
- 1.4. Races will be judged according to the guidelines for Rule 42 enforcement in Appendix 8 of the ISSA PR.
- 1.5. Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, as modified by ISSA Procedural Rule 13(c) will be in effect.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1. This is an Open Regatta as described in the NWISA District Rules. 'Active' and 'Mixed' teams may attend.
- 2.2. 'Gold' teams may be mixed teams. Gold and Silver fleet splits are determined by the skill level of the sailors. Only races between active teams will be used to determine berths to NWISA Team Race Championships or ISSA Baker Team Race Championships.
- 2.3. Teams shall be comprised of a minimum of 6 sailors.
- 2.4. Sailors must be registered by NWISA by 1700 the day before the event. A General Disqualification penalty will be issued to any teams using an unregistered sailor. In cases of unregistered sailors sailing on an active team in the gold fleet, the team will not be eligible for ranking or qualification for NWISA Team Race Championships.
- 2.5. A Gold and Silver fleet may be created if sufficient teams register. If insufficient teams register to create two fleets, all teams will sail together in a single fleet.
- 2.6. Teams shall be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.

3. ENTRY AND ENTRY FEE:

- 3.1. **All NWISA teams are encouraged to participate. If you need assistance with boats, with registration, or have questions about the regatta please contact the regatta host or district representative.**
- 3.2. Eligible schools shall register through the NWISA website link. Registration is on a first come, first served basis if berths are limited. Registration opens Monday, March 30 at 1100.

- 3.3. Registration closes Monday April 6 at 2200. Additional registrations are allowed after this time, but teams may be turned away if event capacity is reached.
- 3.4. Teams unable to compete once registration closes, shall notify the regatta chair as soon as possible.
- 3.5. Each competitor must have a signed [waiver](#) on file.
- 3.6. An entry fee of \$10 per sailor payable to: "Kitsap Sailing Foundation" will be collected at check in (programs bringing multiple teams must pay per team).

4. BOATS AND FORMAT:

- 4.1 This regatta will be sailed in FJs.
- 4.2 Host can provide 8 matched boats.
- 4.3 Teams should plan to bring necessary boats to fill each fleet. Please bring quality, class legal sails for Gold Fleet boats. Register all sail numbers and colors in the registration spreadsheet ASAP to avoid any duplicates.
- 4.4 Gold fleet race committee boat: Red m/v "Codfather"
- 4.5 Silver fleet race committee boat: White m/v "Hawk"

5. SCHEDULE:

Saturday, April 11, 2026

- 0930 Report time. Registration.
- 1030 Mandatory Competitors' Meeting.
- 1100 Registration ends.
- 1100 First warning; sailing will continue throughout the day.

Sunday, April 12, 2026

- 0900 Report time.
- 1000 First warning; sailing will continue throughout the day.
- 1500 No warning signals will be given after this time
- 1530 Results and Awards Presentation.

Any changes to the schedule will be posted on the Official Notice Board located on Port of Silverdale Pier.

Sail offs may take place after the end of racing on Sunday.

6. RACING AREA:

- 6.1. All races will be sailed on Dyes Inlet.
- 6.2. Boat rotations will occur from Port of Silverdale floating docks.

7. HOUSING:

- 7.1. Please contact regatta host ASAP, if housing is desired.

8. TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION:

Teams are responsible for their own transportation. The address of the regatta site is: 3337 NW Byron St. Silverdale, WA.

9. COACHING:

- 9.1. Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors, and other support personnel shall not go afloat in the sailing area from Saturday morning to the end of racing Sunday unless an exception has been explicitly permitted by the regatta chair. The penalty for failing to comply with this requirement may be the disqualification of all boats, competitors and teams associated with the infringing support personnel.
- 9.2. Competitors may receive coaching including instructions, assistance, equipment, or sustenance only while on the designated rotation float or on shore.
- 9.3. Gold Race committee VHF channel 68; Silver Race committee VHF channel 69.

10. Drones

- 10.1. The use of drones is expressly prohibited, as stated in ISSA Procedural Rule 5.2.

11. CONDUCT

- 11.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841.
- 11.2. Infringements of this regulation and/or other inappropriate conduct occurring during the regatta, may be the basis for a hearing under RRS 69.1. The protest committee for such a hearing shall, at a time and place selected by it, meet to hear said protest, and it may impose scoring penalties, or other sanctions that it deems appropriate, including summary removal from the regatta.
- 11.3. Unless directly permitted by the NWISA Rep, Regatta Chair, or PRO, radio communication involving anyone other than on the water personnel or the NWISA Rep and Regatta Chair is expressly prohibited.
