BIO 110 Principles of Biology & BIO 111 Lab

CHE 110 General Chemistry (DAT) & CHE 111 General Chemistry Lab (offered Fall and Spring) OR CHE 105 Foundations of Chemistry I (DAT) & CHE 106 Foundations of Chemistry I Lab (offered Fall Only)

*Before you can register for CHE 105 or CHE 110, you are required to take the Chemistry placement exam. (CHE 105/106 offered Fall only. BIO 218 Fundamentals of Microbiology and BIO 219 Lab OR if biology major, BIO 360 Microbiology and BIO 361 Lab BIO 201 and BIO 202 required if planning to take BIO 360)

PSY 100 Introduction to Psychology (offered both Fall and Spring; flexible either semester second or third year)

PHY 120 General Physics I (MCAT) & PSY 121 General Physics I Lab (offered Fall only)

HES 230 Human Anatomy & Physiology I & HES 231 Human Anatomy & Physiology I Lab (offered Fall only)

PSY 100 Introduction to Psychology (offered both Fall and Spring; flexible either semester second or third year)

PHY 170 General Physics II (some content on MCAT) & PHY 171 General Physics II Lab (offered Spring only)

Indiana University

One additional 200 level Biology course animal or developmental, must be taken in person

Pacific University College of Optometry, OR

One course taken from the English Department or Writing is required. A course in writing composition, expository, technical or scientific writing is strongly recommended.

Western University of Health Sciences, California

One additional 200 level BIO course with lab

Two courses in English Composition, English Literature, Writing or Critical Thinking (FTS 100 counts as one) of the required writing courses.

Illinois College of Optometry

One course in Social Science, examples of acceptable subject areas include (but are not limited to) courses that carry an Institution designation in: Humanities, Religious Studies and Philosophy, or Human Behavior and Social.
