

Senior Badminton

1. The rules governing Senior badminton shall be the laws of badminton as Adopted by the International Badminton Federation and the Canadian Badminton Association with the exception that all games go to 15 points.

- 2. A High School member team will consist of two competitors in singles (boys and girls), doubles (boys and girls) and mixed doubles in the three age classifications set by the ASAA (Junior, Intermediate and Senior).
- 3. The competition will attempt to be a two-section round robin consisting of one game. Semi-final and medal games are single games won at 15 points with a cap at 21. (At the discretion of the commissioner adjusting to 11 or 13 points may occur to account for time constraints.)
- 4. Tie breaking procedure: If two or more teams are tied the following criteria will be applied in the following order:
 - a. All ties for first and second place shall be determined by the result of the match between the tied teams.
 - b. Total points won minus total points lost (amongst the tied teams).
 - c. If the tie still exists, total points won minus points lost (within total Round Robin play).
 - d. Extra playoff game through the use of a coin toss to decide which team receives a bye while the other two playoff a single game.
- 5. A competitor may enter only one event.
