- **President’s Report – B.K.**
 - Council member Ma proposed prioritizing our CEC school liaison work with a goal of 100% completion of our school liaison visits this year and this suggestion is adopted as our top priority.
 - Recognized the council members who have taken the steps to reach out and visit their liaison schools as well as the D22 principals for working with us.
 - Established a Civic Engagement Committee to ensure that we have the connections and relationships in the community we need to advocate for the needs of the schools.
