For this assignment, you will write an analytical essay comparing and/or contrasting two or more of the stories we've read so far this trimester (by Bradbury, Calvino, and/or Miller). You may reference and reuse elements from your response papers. Center your thesis statement around comparing/contrasting a theme you've identified, character, relationship, exploration of space or time, setting, or narrative technique.

STRUCTURE: The essay should be a minimum of 4 full paragraphs (minimum 6 sentences per paragraph) and follow this structure:

- Introductory paragraph: Introduce your topic and briefly explain background info your reader needs to know. Imagine the reader of your essay has not read the pieces you are discussing, so give a brief synopsis and introduce the titles and authors. Include an engaging hook to draw the reader in. The last line of your intro paragraph should be your thesis statement: a clear sentence explaining an argument you will make with supporting examples throughout the essay.
- Body paragraphs: Dedicate at least one body paragraph to each reading and include specific <u>quotes and examples</u> to support your thesis. (Required! One quote per body paragraph is recommended.) Explain your own analysis and insights into the significance of these examples.
- Concluding paragraph: Tie together and compare/contrast your examples from the reading in a manner that connects back to your thesis statement, perhaps in a way that sheds new light on it, adds nuance, or simply affirms your argument. Add any final analysis and leave the reader with a clear takeaway.

FORMAT: Formatting guidelines are based on MLA standards, and a more detailed reference guide can be found here (also linked on HW Hub): https/owl.purdue.edu/owl/research and citation/mla style/mla formatting and style guide/index.html

- The essay must be typed in double-spaced Times New Roman 12-point font with standard 1-inch margins.
- Include a header in the top right corner with your last name followed by the page number.
- Include a heading on the top left with your name, my name (Maryann Ullmann), the course title (Speculative Fiction) and the date (i.e. 16 January 2025).
- Include an original title, centered under the heading, that alludes to the topic of your essay.
- Structure your essay as indicated above and indent the beginning of each paragraph with no extra space between paragraphs.
- Include in-text citations after quotes with the author last name and page number in parentheses. For example: (Miller 6).
- Proofread your essay for grammar, spelling, and punctuation.
