District Advisory Board (DAB) Update

The District Advisory Board had their first meeting of the year. The District Advisory Board (DAB) is a group of parent representatives that advise the district on a variety of issues. It acts as a link between the community and the district.

The update from the Board of Education was about the heat in schools. Everyone is looking at alternatives and determining what can be done. The district contracted with an energy management/building efficiency firm, McKinstry, to look at the cost and feasibility of installing air conditioning in all schools. Anything that is decided upon will take time to implement. In early October the district will be sending out a Calendar Survey. This is done every two years to help them get input on creating calendars for future school years. This is a great way to share your thoughts about the school year, including any issues you may have regarding the heat in buildings. There are a lot of trade-offs and requirements when creating the calendar, but they value your feedback.


