In The introduction should be clear and provide the problem to be addressed in the manuscript. Before the objectives, the authors should provide adequate background, and a very brief literature survey to record existing solutions, to show which is the best of the previous studies, to show the main limitations of the previous studies, to show what you hope to achieve (solve the limitations), and to show the scientific merit or novelty of the paper.

2. **RESEARCH METHODOLOGY**

This method is optional for research articles. It is descriptive and should provide a statement of the research methodology. It should provide the reader with a description of the methods used as much as possible. This method is optional, only for research articles

3. **DISCUSSION**

This section is the most important part of your article. The analysis or research results should be clear and concise. The results should summarize the (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Please highlight the differences between your results or findings and previous publications by other researchers.

4. **CONCLUSION**

The conclusion contains a description that should answer the research objectives. Provide clear and concise conclusions. Do not repeat the Abstract or just describe the research results. Provide a clear explanation of possible applications and/or suggestions related to the research findings.

BIBLIOGRAPHY

Bibliography at the end of the manuscript. Cite only the items you have read and written in the footnote. Please use Reference Manager Apps such as EndNote, Mendeley, Zotero, etc. Use other articles published in the same journal as the model. All publications cited in the text should be included in the References section and organized alphabetically.

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
