- **Lesson pickup** Please be reminded that if you chose paper packets for your child, you will be able to pick those up on either Wednesday (April 22) or Thursday (April 23) of this week. We are planning to distribute packets on Wednesday and Thursday each week through the end of the school year (June 2, 2020).
 - PK-3rd Grade at Elsa Meyer (Times: 8:00-11:00 a.m., 12:00-3:00 p.m., and 4:00-7:00 p.m.)
 - 4-7th Grade at the Middle School (Times: 8:00-11:00 a.m., 12:00-3:00 p.m., and 4:00-7:00 p.m.)
 - 8th Grade - 12th Grade at the High School (Times: 8:00-11:00 a.m., 12:00-3:00 p.m., and 4:00-7:00 p.m.)When you pull up to a site, a paraprofessional will ask you for your child's name needing a packet. There will be no need for you to get out of your vehicle. I appreciate your patience as we work through this. If you chose the online method, there would be no need to pick up a packet.
