

Child Find: Identifying Children with Disabilities

As part of its responsibility under the **Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEIA, 2004)**, Westerville City Schools is conducting its annual **Child Find** campaign.

The purpose of Child Find is to **identify**, **locate**, **and evaluate** children—from birth through age 21—who may have disabilities and are not currently receiving special education services. This includes children who:

- Reside within the Westerville City School District
- Are homeless or wards of the state
- Attend private or nonpublic schools, regardless of the severity of their disability

Q What Happens If a Child Is Referred?

When the district is notified about a child with a known or suspected disability:

- 1. District staff will collaborate with the child's parent or guardian
- 2. A **referral** will be made to determine needed supports
- 3. The team will develop and monitor **interventions** based on the child's needs
- 4. An **evaluation** may be conducted to determine eligibility for special education services
