College of Pharmacy Early Assurance Program

- Exceptional HS Seniors with a desire to pursue pharmacy
- Early Assurance Program students earn conditional acceptance to the MUSC Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) program after the successful completion of college-level prerequisite courses at any accredited college or university, and maintenance of certain academic criteria.
- Application deadline in May
- Have a 3.2 or higher unweighted GPA at the end of the fall semester of their senior year
- By the end of their spring semester, achieve admittance to an accredited undergraduate program of their choice
- Commit to pursuing a career in pharmacy by taking the most demanding science and math courses available

Career Exploration Programs

- MUSC Health recognizes the value of visitors and developing future healthcare workers and collaborates with a variety of partnerships to enhance the awareness and training of individuals interested in health care careers through career exploration and development.
- Career Exploration Programs offered:
 - o Job Shadowing: 1 - 3 days
 - o Observation: 4 days - 3 months
 - o Mentoring: 3 months - 1 year
 - o Clinical Sponsorship: academically required rotations; 1 week - 1 year
 - o Visiting Practitioners: 1 week - 1 year
- **Applications open year round**
- **Students must already have MUSC Sponsor/Health Care Professional before applying**

Health Professions Exploration Program (HPEP)

- The MUSC College of Health Professions' Health Professions Exploration Program (HPEP) is a mentoring program for high school and undergraduate college students interested in the health professions. The program identifies a current College of Health Professions student to serve as a mentor for a high school or undergraduate student. Program sessions are held once or twice a month on Saturdays.
